ASBESTOS PRODUCTION IN CANADA - NOVEMBER, 1934.

Shipments of asbestos by Canadian producers in November reached the highest point on record since November, 1933; the totals were 20,240 tons and 20,849 tons, respectively. In October, 18,391 tons were shipped. The Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa reports that during the eleven months ending November, 149,297 tons of asbestos were shipped as compared with 140,714 tons in the corresponding period of 1933.

Exports of asbestos from Canada in November rose to 18,504 tons from the preceding month's total of 16,225 tons. The United States purchased 65.5 per cent of the Canadian exports in November and Great Britain, 12.9 per cent.

The value of asbestos products imported into Canada in November increased 23.7 per cent to \$54,359 as compared with \$43,961 in October. Asbestos brake and clutch lining receipts in November were appraised at \$9,273 or 8.5 per cent below the previous month's valuation. Imports of asbestos packing amounted to 21,649 pounds worth \$6,631; in October 8,831 pounds at \$4,054 were imported. Other asbestos manufactures imported during November were valued at \$38,455, consisting of 57.9 per cent from the United States, 38.7 per cent from Great Britain, 2.3 per cent from British South Africa and the remainder from Austria, Germany and France.
