ASBESTOS PRODUCTION IN CANADA, MARCH, 1934.

Canadian producers reported a production of 12,629 tons of asbestos in March as compared with 9,256 tons in February and 5,558 tons in March, 1933, according to a statement issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. Shipments during the first quarter totalled 30,387 tons or 76.6 per cent above the tonnage shipped in the corresponding period of 1933.

Exports of Canadian asbestos advanced to 13,377 tons in March from the preceding month's total of 8,976 tons. In March, 1933, asbestos exports were recorded at 6,559 tons.

Canada imported asbestos products valued at \$68,234 in March as against the February valuation of \$44,439. Receipts of brake and clutch lining in March were appraised at \$21,583 made up of 82.9 per cent from the United States and the remainder from Great Britain. In February the import valuation was \$12,914. Asbestos packing importations amounted to 13,505 pounds worth \$5,777 as compared with 5,882 pounds at \$3,055 imported in February. Imports of other asbestos manufactures during March were valued at \$40,874 consisting of 50.9 per cent from the United States, 46.7 per cent from Great Britain and the remainder from Germany. In February Canada imported other asbestos manufactures to a value of \$28,470 of which the United States supplied 59.3 per cent and Great Britain, 40.7 per cent.
