ASBESTOS PRODUCTION IN CANADA, JUNE, 1934.

Asbestos production in Canada during June amounted to 13,719 tons, an advance of 4.2 per cent over the May total of 13,171 tons and 8.1 per cent over the June, 1933, output of 12,690 tons, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. The total production during the first six months of 1934 was 67,888 tons as compared with 49,550 tons in the corresponding period of 1933.

Canada exported 12,846 tons of asbestos during June; in the preceding month 12,635 tons were exported. Approximately 62 per cent of the June exports were consigned to the United States.

Asbestos products imported into Canada during June were valued at \$64,346 as against the May valuation of \$74,121. Receipts of aspestos brake and clutch lining declined in value to \$28,003 from the May total of \$29,145. Asbestos packing importations showed a falling-off; the June imports amounted to 10,443 pounds worth \$4,056 while in May, 24,714 pounds with a value of \$8,715 were imported. Imports of other asbestos products were appraised at \$32,287; the United States supplied 64.5 per cent of these importations and Great Britain 34.1 per cent, the remainder was obtained from Germany and Belgium.
