ASBESTOS PRODUCTION IN CANADA - NOVEMBER, 1935.

Shipments of asbestos by Canadian producers during November totalled 25,528 tons as compared with 27,105 tons in October and 19,742 tons in November, 1934, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the eleven months ending November shipments reached a total of 194,240 tons; this represented an increase of 33.4 per cent over the tonnage shipped during the period January to November, 1934.

Exports of asbestos from Canada in November were recorded at 21,506 tons as against 23,007 tons in the preceding month. Approximately 78.7 per cent of the November shipments were consigned to the United States.

The Canadian imports of asbestos products declined 12.5 per cent in value during November to \$63,070 from the October total of \$72,041. The value of brake and clutch lining receipts was 36.7 per cent lower in November at \$14,818. Asbestos packing imports were recorded at 8,812 pounds worth \$4,036 as compared with 7,327 pounds at \$45,503 in October. Other asbestos products imported in November were evaluated at \$44,216 made up of 53.9 per cent from Great Britain, 41.4 per cent from the United States, and the remainder from South Africa, Germany and Belgium.
