## MONTHLY REPORT

## ASBESTOS PRODUCTION IN CANADA - DECEMBER, 1935.

Canadian producers reported shipments totalling 15,924 tons in December as against 25,528 tons shipped in November, according to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. Shipments during the calendar year 1935 were 34.7 per cent higher than in the preceding year and totalled 210,164 tons.

Canada exported 25,650 tons of asbestos in December; during the preceding month 21,506 tons were exported. Shipments to the United States accounted for 63.4 per cent of the December exportations. During 1935 the Canadian exports of asbestos totalled 200,211 tons; this represented an increase of 26.5 per cent over the tonnage exported in 1934.

The value of asbestos products imported into Canada in December declined to \$46,203 from the preceding month's total of \$63,070. Brake and clutch lining importations were valued at \$11,268 as compared with the November valuation of \$14,818. Receipts of asbestos packing in December totalled 16,944 pounds worth \$4,733; in November 8,812 pounds at \$4,036 were imported. Imports of other asbestos products into Canada in December were appraised at \$30,202 of which the United States contributed 38.4 per cent, Great Britain, 60.8 per cent, and Belgium and Germany, the remainder.
