ASBESTOS PRODUCTION IN CANADA - FEBRUARY, 1935.

Canadian producers shipped 11,844 tons of asbestos during February as compared with 10,506 tons in the preceding month and 9,256 tons in February, 1934, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the first two months of 1935 shipments totalled 22,350 tons or 25.9 per cent above the tonnage shipped in the corresponding period of 1934.

Customs' records show that 9,910 tons of asbestos were exported from Canada during February; in the previous month 11,068 tons were exported. The United States purchased 82.1 per cent of the February, 1935, exports.

Imports of asbestos products into Canada in February were valued at \$54,609 as against \$39,117 in January and \$44,439 in February, 1934. The value of brake and clutch lining imports advanced to \$23,328 from the January total of \$14,133. Asbestos packing importations also increased; the February receipts amounted to 9,685 pounds worth \$4,928 and the January, 5,880 pounds at \$2,685. Imports of other asbestos products during February were appraised at \$26,353, of which the United States supplied 62.9 per cent; Great Britain, 35.0 per cent; and Germany, the remainder. The January imports of other asbestos products were worth \$22,299, made up of 58.3 per cent from the United States, 39.7 per cent from Great Britain and the remainder from Germany, France, Austria and Italy.
