ASBESTOS PRODUCTION IN CANADA - APRIL, 1935.

Canadian producers shipped 14,702 tons of asbestos during April according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. In March, 11,816 tons were shipped and in April, 1934 shipments amounted to 10,611 tons. During the first four months of 1935 Canadian shipments totalled 45,868 tons, this represented an increase of 19.2 per cent over the tonnage shipped in the corresponding months of 1934.

Custom's records show that Canada exported 9,588 tons of asbestos during April as against 12,403 tons in March. The United States received 90.3 per cent of the April exports; the remainder was consigned to Japan, Germany, Australia, United Kingdom and Belgium.

Imports of asbestos products into Canada in April were valued at \$57,700 or 13.5 per cent below the total for the previous month. Brake and clutch lining importations in April were appraised at \$21,362; the March imports were worth \$20,427. Receipts of asbestos packing in April rose to 13,380 pounds valued at \$8,867 from the March total of 10,905 pounds at \$4,344. Imports of other asbestos products declined in value to \$27,471 from the March valuation of \$41,942.
