ASBESTOS PRODUCTION IN CANADA - MAY, 1935.

Asbestos production in Canada during May advanced to 18,562 tons from the April total of 14,702 tons and the May, 1934, shipments of 13,171 tons, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. Canadian shipments during the five months ending May totalled 67,430 tons or 24.5 per cent above the tonnage shipped in the corresponding period of 1934.

Exports of asbestos from Canada in May were recorded at 16,132 tons as compared with 9,588 tons in April and 12,633 tons in May, 1934. Shipments to the United States accounted for 71.2 per cent of the May, 1935, exports.

The value of asbestos products imported into Canada in May declined to \$51,818 from the preceding month's total of \$57,700. Imports of brake and clutch lining during May were appraised at \$19,417 or 9.1 per cent below the April valuation. Asbestos packing importations amounted to 17,113 pounds at \$6,500; in April, 13,380 pounds worth \$8,867 were imported. Other asbestos products imported into Canada in May were valued at \$25,901, of which 63.4 per cent came from the United States, 34.8 per cent from Great Britain and the remainder from Austria, Germany and Jugo-Slavia.
