## MONTHLY REPORT

## ASBESTOS PRODUCTION IN CANADA - NOVEMBER, 1936.

Canadian producers reported shipments of asbestos in November amounting to 37,086 tons; in October, 38,231 tons were shipped while in November, 1935, shipments totalled 25,565 tons, according to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the eleven months ending November, 279,642 tons of asbestos were shipped as compared with 194,520 tons a year ago.

Customs' records show that 33,071 tons of asbestos were exported from Canada in November; during the preceding month 34,714 tons were exported. Sixty-nine per cent of the November exportations were consigned to the United States.

Imports of asbestos products into Canada in November were appraised at \$68,855 or 27.5 per cent below the October valuation. Brake and clutch lining importations in November were worth \$17,527; the preceding month's import valuation was \$36,005. Receipts of asbestos packing amounted to 11,593 pounds at \$4,232 as against 10,081 pounds worth \$4,393 imported in October. Other asbestos products imported into Canada in November were valued at \$47,096; Great Britain accounted for 59.50 per cent of these imports; the United States, 40.49 per cent, and Belgium, the remainder.
