## MONTHLY REPORT

## ASBESTOS PRODUCTION IN CANADA - FEBRUARY, 1936.

Canadian producers shipped 17,038 tons of asbestos in February as compared with 17,016 tons shipped in the preceding month and 11,844 tons in February, 1935, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa.

An advance of 18 per cent was recorded in the exports of asbestos from Canada in February; the month's total was 17,191 tons as against 14,567 tons in January. During the first two months of 1936 asbestos exports totalled 31,758 tons; in the corresponding period of the previous year 20,978 tons were exported.

Canada imported asbestos products to a value of \$51,369 in February; this represented an increase of 1.8 per cent over the January valuation. Brake and clutch lining importations in February were appraised at \$22,550 as compared with \$23,919 in the preceding month. Receipts of asbestos packing amounted to 11,782 pounds worth \$4,940; in January 13,487 pounds at \$4,192 were imported. Imports of other asbestos products were valued at \$23,879, made up of 61.0 per cent from the United States, 34.8 per cent from Great Britain, and the remainder from France, Austria, Belgium and Germany.
