ASBESTOS PRODUCTION IN CANADA - NOVEMBER, 1939

Shipments of asbestos by Canadian producers were recorded at 40,568 tons in November; in October, 44,622 tons were shipped while in November, 1933 the total was lower at 29,471 tons, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the eleven months ending November, 332,078 tons were shipped or 21.9 per cent above the quantity shipped a year ago.

Exports of asbestos from Canada amounted to 41,202 tons compared with 43,183 tons in October; during the period January to November, 307,345 tons were exported from Canada.

Imports of asbestos products into Canada in November were appraised at \$118,390 and were made up of:
