MONTHLY REPORT

ASBESTOS PRODUCTION IN CANADA - SEPTEMBER, 1939.

Shipments of asbestos during September rose to 38,124 tons; according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During August, 35,886 tons were shipped while in September, 1938 shipments totalled 28,297 tons. An increase of 18.3 per cent was recorded in the shipments during the first nine months of 1939 compared with the tonnage shipped a year ago; the totals were 246,888 tons and 208,632 tons, respectively.

Exports of asbestos from Canada in September amounted to 32,760 tons; in the preceding month, 29,733 tons were exported. Fifty-five per cent of the September exports were consigned to the United States, 15.3 per cent to Japan, 15.1 per cent to Great Britain and the remainder to France, Belgium, Australia, Denmark, New Zealand, the Netherlands, Italy, Germany and Cuba.

Imports of asbestos products into Canada in September were appraised at \$97,692 and were made up of:


