


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# THE SALT INDUSTRY

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**NOTICE**


Volume I consists of the following parts:

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## THE SALT INDUSTRY

### 1953

Producers' shipments of common salt or sodium chloride during 1953 amounted to 954,928 tons valued at \$6,974,501 f.o.b. works, excluding the cost of containers. In the preceding year the shipments amounted to 971,903 tons valued at \$7,774,815. Of the total output Ontario plants produced 78 per cent, Nova Scotia 13 per cent and the remainder was produced in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta.

There were 12 plants operated by 7 firms. The average number of employees in the industry was 676 to whom \$1,957,318 were paid as salaries and wages. Fuel and electricity cost \$959,927, including

10,537,992 kwh. of purchased electricity at a cost of \$82,541. Electricity generated for the firms' own use totalled 15,712,264 kwh. Process supplies cost \$434,818 and the value of containers was \$1,431,288.

Exports of salt in 1953 amounted to 2,354 tons valued at \$32,499. Imports totalled 307,333 tons valued at \$2,017,474. The apparent consumption of salt in Canada, for all purposes, computed from producers' shipments plus imports less exports, without allowance for change in stocks, totalled 1,259,907 tons.
