



THE SALT INDUSTRY, 1957

During 1957 the producers of common salt or sodium chloride shipped 1,771,559 tons valued at \$13,989,703 compared with 1,590,804 tons valued \$12,144,476 in the preceding year. The value of containers has been excluded from these valuations. About 30 per cent of the total tonnage was recorded as the salt content of brine. This brine was pumped from the wells to chemical plants which produced caustic soda, chlorine, etc. Shipments of rock salt increased from 640,027 in 1956 to 786,975 tons in 1957.

The leading province was Ontario with 87 per cent of the total shipments Nova Scotia had the second largest production, followed by Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba.

The development of a rock salt deposit near Pugwash, Nova Scotia was continued by Sifto Salt

Limited. Exploration work was done on salt deposits near London and Also at Goderich, Ontario.

Twelve plants were operated by seven firms which employed at the plants 800 persons to whom \$3,118,482 were paid in salaries and wages. Fuel and electricity cost \$1,141,665 including 18,389,537 kwh of purchased electricity at a cost of \$173,315. Electricity generated for the firms' own use totalled 9,270,732 kwh. Process supplies cost \$649,203 and the value of containers was \$1,852,346.

Exports of salt, largely rock salt, during 1957 were 457,888 tons valued at \$3,241,119. Imports totalled 367,480 tons valued at \$1,649,217. The apparent consumption of salt in Canada, computed from producers' shipments plus imports less exports without allowance for change in stocks, totalled 1,681,151 tons.


