## ESTIMATED VALUES OF SHIPMENTS, INVENTORY OWNED AND UNFILLED ORDERS IN ALL MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES



Value of manufacturers' shipments and new orders in December were 1.0 per cent and 1.5 per cent off respectively from November according to the preliminary estimate. These decreases in December, however, were much less than the usual seasonal drops as the seasonally adjusted estimates for December shipments and new orders were 4.0 per cent and 4.4 per cent higher respectively, rising from the revised figures of $\$ 2,973$ million and $\$ 3,014 \mathrm{million}$ in November to $\$ 3,093 \mathrm{million}$ and $\$ 3,146$ million. The backlog of unfilled orders at the end of December valued at $\$ 3,177$ million was 0.7 per cent above the November level, while manufacturers' inventories owned expanded 1.8 per cent in December from $\$ 5,599$ million to $\$ 5,702$ mililon.

At the preliminary estimate of $\$ 3,052$ milifon, December shipments were 13.5 per cent higher than the total for the corresponding month of last year, and brought the total value of shipments for 1965 to $\$ 34,101$ million, 8.1 per cent above the value of $\$ 31,560 \mathrm{million}$ in 1964. Shipments of non-durable goods producers dropped 3.9 per cent in December, largely the result of seasonal factors, to $\$ 1,544 \mathrm{milli}$ n from the revised $\$ 1,607$ million in November. The largest seasonal decline in shipments occurred in the clothing industries where shipments were 26.3 per cent lower than in the previous month. The foods and beverages industries which account for about one-third of the value of shipments in the non-durable goods industries also showed a seasonal decrease in December, but of less than three per cent. Shipments in the tobacco industries, on the other hand, rose very strongly, again reflecting mainly seasonal factors. Durable goods manufacturers' shipments in December amounted to $\$ 1,508$ million, up 2.1 per cent from November, with higher absolute value increases shown by the electrical products industries and the transportation equipment industries, and with a substantial seasonal decrease recorded in the wood industries.

Total value of inventories held in the manufacturing industries at the end of December rose 1.9 per cent to the value of $\$ 5,992$ million, or 1.2 per cent to a seasonally adjusted estimate of $\$ 5,982$ million. Following the trend of the previous year, the change in stocks in December was largely centered in raw materials and goods in process. Seasonally adjusted inventories owned at the end of December also increased by 1.1 per cent to $\$ 5,682 \mathrm{million}$, a level 10.5 per cent above the comparable figure of a year ago. The ratio of inventories owned to shipments in December was up to 1.87 from 1.82 in November, while the ratio of finished products inventories to shipments at 0.64 , scarcely changed from last month.

About two-thirds of the manufacturers' gain in inventories at the end of December came from the 2.4 per cent increase in the durable goods industries whose month-end inventories owned in 1965 averaged 12.5 per cent higher than the level a year earlier. The 1.3 per cent increase of non-durable goods producers' end-ofDecember inventories owned was reflected entirely in raw materials. Relatively marked build-ups in inventories owned were recorded in the rubber industries, the machinery industries, the leather industries, the chemical and chemical products industries and the transportation equipment industries.

The decrease in new orders received by manufacturers during December was large$1 y$ concentrated in the non-durable goods industries which was down by 2.7 per cent. As shipments dropped by more than this amount, outstanding orders at the end of the month increased by 2.7 per cent from last month. The backlog of unfilled orders reported by the durable goods industries showed only a small increase of 0.3 per cent from November to December. The average level of manufacturers' month end unfilled orders throughout 1965 was estimated at 18.4 per cent higher than the comparable level of 1964.

## CONCEPTS

Shipments - (Tables 1 to 4) - represent an estimated projection, on monthly basis, of the latest available Census of Manufactures values.

New Orders - (Tables 2 and 3) - This series is designed to indicate the rate at which new business is being received. It is defined as all New orders Received during the period, at estimated selling values. Thus it covers total new orders, net of cancellations, regardless of whether the orders will be filled from stock or as a result of activity during the same month (and, therefore, will also be reported as shipments in the month received) or whether they will be added to existing backlogs.

Unfilled Orders - (Tables 2 and 3) - are defined as orders on books at the end of the period stated. That is, they cover orders received but not yet shipped (or treated as a sale), irrespective of work done on them or of stocks from which they can be filled.

Total Inventory Owned - (Tables 2 to 4) - represents the estimated book value of Inventory owned by manufacturers in connection with the manufacturing operations of the establishment covered whether held at plant or elsewhere, at the end of the period stated. It is made up of: raw materials, goods in process, finished goods of own manufacture less the value of inventory held but not owned which cannot be assigned to specific components. Since the series relates to manufacturing inventory only, value of goods purchased for re-sale is not included.

Inventory Held but Not Owned - (Tables 2 and 3) - represents, as far as possible, the portion of manufacturers' total inventory holdings which are no longer owned by the reporting manufacturers because of payments made on long-term contracts as wark on these progresses. This item is applicable only to the relatively few industries where long-term contracts are comon although, because of the nature of the item, the value per industry is high.

Because of variations in accounting methods there are a few cases where it is not possible to obtain values for this type of inventory. The estimated value shown for this item must therefore be considered to some extent incomplete.

Total Inventory Held - (Tables 2 and 3) - represents the estimed total value of manuacturers' inventory holdings in connection with manufacturing operations, regardless of ownership; it differs from inventory owned by the inclusion of inventories held under progress payments arxangements.

Inventory Components - (Tables 2 and 3) - Raw Materials, Goods in Process, and Finished Products are reported and compiled as on the books of each manufacturex, i.e. there has been no atrempt to define the components specifically for each industry.

The inventory components are always a breakdown of total inventoxy held, not of total inventory owned. in industies where these two items differ, due to the inclusion of inventory held but not awned (see above), it is not possible to obtain value of inventory owned by components since, where separate progress accounts are maintained, firms concerned can only state that, of total holdings, a certain amount is not longer owned by them. It is fairly obviaus that the bulk of such payments apply to goods in process holdings but due to time lags in shipments and to prepayments some of the total value of inventory held but not owned would be applicable to finished products or raw materials.

Any comparisons of shipments/inventory ratios should be made using total inventory owned, not total inventory held, since the latter includes values which have already been written off to sales. If shipments/inventory ratios are desired using inventory components, rather than total inventory, a reasonable approximation to tocal inventory owned by components would be obtained by assuming that all inventory held but not owned had been included with goods in process.

Groupings - The Standard Industrial Classification groupings of industries used in Tables 3 and 4 are defined according to the Standard Industrial Classiftcation Manual. A list of the industries included in the Standard Industrial Classification greups will be Eound on page 40 of the bulletin.

Monthly (or, in a few cases, quarterly) reports covering value of inventories and shipments are now submitted on a voluntary basis by 3,000 plants 10120 industries; in addition, 3,000 smali plants in 100 of these industries report monthly shipments only. Of the first group, 1,025 plants in 83 industries also report new and unfilled orders. Two industies are included in the total shipments estimates by using data avallable from other Bureau series, and they are also included in the toral inventory estimates.

## FOOTNOTES TO TABLES

TABLE 1. - (1) Prince Edward Island, Yukon and Northwest Territories are not published separately. They are included in the total for Canada.

TABLE 3. - (1) The value of Unfilled Orders and, therefore, of New Orders for industries in major groups - $1,2,6,8,9,10,17,18$ and 19 is small and sample coverage is not adequate to provide separate estimates for them.
(2) The value of inventory held but not owned in this group is very small, and sample coverage is not adequate to provide separate data. Estimates for this type of inventory are included with Total Inventory Held; for all practical purposes this can be considered the equivalent of Inventory Owned.
