Preliminary estimates indicate the following trends for January:
Shipments: Manufacturers' shipments in January were valued at $\$ 1,716,187,000$, down 2 per cent from the revised December value of $\$ 1,750,077,000$, but up 5 per cent from the January 1958 total of $\$ 1,641,308,000$. In the seven preceding years, January shipments generally decreased from December by an average of 3 per cent.

Using the Economic-Use Classification, the comparison of shipments values in January with the revised values for December, 1958, showed increases in the following groups: Semi-Durable Consumers' Goods (5\%); Industries Producing Largely for Export group (5\%); Intermediate Goods and Supplies group (3\%). Increases in January in the Semi-Durable Consumers' Goods group have ranged between $1 \%$ and $15 \%$ in the $s i x$ preceding years. The Industries Producing Largely for Export group showed decreases of $2 \%$ to $7 \%$ in January of four of the $s i x$ preceding years, and increases of $6 \%$ and $11 \%$ in 1953 and 1955, respectively. Increases in the Intermediate Goods and Supplies group averaged $6 \%$ in four of the six preceding years, with decreases of less than $1 \%$ in the remaining two years ( 1955 and 1956).

Decreases in January, compared to December 1958, occurred in the following groups: Durable Consumers ${ }^{1}$ Goods ( $11 \%$ ); Construction Goods ( $10 \%$ ) ; Motor Vehicles and Related Industries ( $10 \%$ ); Heavy Transportation and Equipment ( $6 \%$ ); Perishable Consumers ${ }^{1}$ Goods ( $5 \%$ ); Other Capital Goods ( $3 \%$ ); and a fractional decrease in the Unclassifiable group of industries. In the six preceding years, the Durable Consumers' Goods group and the Construction Goods group show decreases in January ranging from $9 \%$ to $19 \%$ for the former and from $1 \%$ to $16 \%$ for the latter. The Motor Vehicles and Related Industries group showed a decrease in January of 1958 and 1956 ( $11 \%$ and $6 \%$, respectively) but showed increases of $3 \%$ to $12 \%$ in January of the remaining four of the $s i x$ preceding years. The Heavy Transportation and Equipment group showed an average decrease of $18 \%$ over the six preceding years. December-January decreases in values of shipments have been customary in the Perishable Consumer Goods group, but in a pattern of progressively smaller decreases after the $17 \%$ drop in 1955. Decreases have also been general in the Other Capital Goods group, averaging $8 \%$ over the $81 x$ preceding years. The Unclassifiable group of industries shows an average decrease of $2 \%$ over the preceding six years.

The comparison of January 1959 shipments with January 1958, showed increases in all industry groups except the Heavy Transportation and Equipment group and the Construction Goods group, both of which declined by $26 \%$ and $8 \%$, respectively. Increases in the remaining eight industry groups were as follows: Motor Vehicles and Related Industries group (20\%); Unclassifiable group of industries ( $10 \%$ ); Perishable Consumers' group (9\%); Semi-Durable Consumers' Goods group (8\%); Intermediate Goods and Supplies group ( $6 \%$ ); Durable Consumers' Goods group (4\%); Other Capital Goods group (3\%) ; and the Industries Producing Largely for Export group ( $1 \%$ ).

Inventories: The preliminary estimate of the value of inventory owned by manufacturers at the end of January was $\$ 3,936,137,000$, fractionally ( 0.6 per cent) above the revised December value of $\$ 3,911,424,000$. January inventories are normally above December levels and the increase this year was greater than that in 1958 ( 0.3 per cent) though not as great as in 1956 and 1957 ( 1.9 and 0.9 per cent, respectively). The January value was 4.5 per cent $(\$ 185,651,000)$ below the January 1958 value. The year-over-year decline has decreased steadily since October 1958 when inventories were 7.3 per cent below the October 1957 level.

Total inventory held (including both inventory owned by manufacturers and inventory held under progress payments arrangements) was also fractionally 0.6 per cent $(\$ 24,210,000)$ above the December value, since inventory held under progress payments was practically unchanged. Total inventory held at the end of January was $\$ 4,418,799,000$ compared with a revised December value of $\$ 4,394,589,000$. Raw materials at $\$ 1,=$ $960,331,000$ were very slightly below the December 1958 value though almost 5 per cent below the January 1958 level. Goods in process held at $\$ 1,236,091,000$ were practically unchanged from December but fractionally above the January 1958 level. If the simplifying assumption is made that ali inventory held under progress payments arrangements is in the goods in process held category, then goods in process owned (1.e., less progress payments inventory) at $\$ 753,429,000$ was slightly above the December level but 3 per cent below Jamuary 1958. Finished products inventories at $\$ 1,222,377,000$ were over 2 per cent above the revised December level of $\$ 1,194,507,000$ but more than 5 per cent below the January 1958 value.

Seven of the ten Economic-Use groups showed small increases in inventory investment in January. These increases were generally in line with December-January changes over the past three years; though in three cases: the Perishable Consumers" Goods group, which remained practically unchanged; the Heavy Transportation Equipment Industries, which declined over $3 \%$; and Industries Producing Largely for Export, which showed a $1 \%$ increase; this year's change followed the 1958 pattern rather than that of the two earlier years. Total inventory owned was down over $4 \%$ from the January 1958 level, and the largest year over year declines were in Heavy Transportation Equipment Industries (29\%); Motor Vehicles and Related Industries and Construction Goods Industries ( $12 \%$ each), and Other Capital Goods Industries, and the Semi-Durable Consumer Goods group (each down about 7\%). The only substantial year-over-year increase was in the Perishable Consumers" Goods group (7\%).

The ratios of both total inventory owned to shipments (2.29) and finished products to shipments ( 0.71 ) were above the similar figures for December 1958 ( 2.24 and 0.68 , respectively) but below the January 1958 ratios (2.51 and 0.79).

Orders: The value of new orders received during January was $\$ 1,727,736,000$, down $1 \%$ from the revised December value of $\$ 1,742,123,000$ and down $8 \%$ from the January 1958 value of $\$ 1,886,173,000$. Decreases occurred in January in two of the six preceding years ( $15 \%$ in 1953, and $5 \%$ in 1957 ) with the remaining four years showing December-January increases ranging from $3 \%$ to $12 \%$.

Since shipments for the month were lower than new orders received, the result was an increase of $\$ 11,549,000$ or $1 \%$ in the unfilled orders level. The January value was $\$ 2,122,407,000$, which was $16 \%$ below the level at the end of January 1958.

Using the Economic-Use Classification, the comparison of the value of new orders in January 1959 with December 1958, shows increases in five of the ten industry groups as follows: Heavy Transportation and Equipment group ( $7 \%$ ); Semi-Durable Consumers" Goods group ( $6 \%$ ); Other Capital Goods group ( $6 \%$ ); Industries Producing Largely for Export group (5\%); Unclassiflable group of industries (5\%). The erratic pattern of the Heavy Transportation and Equipment group does not establish any trend for comparison with previous years. The increase in the Semi-Durable Consumers" Goods group is smaller in 1959 than the increases in any of the previous three years. (There were small decreases in this group in 1954 and 1955). The Other Capital Goods group has shown declines in the previous five years ( $5 \%$ to $24 \%$ ) after a $2 \%$ increase in January 1953 . The industries Producing Largely for Export group has shown greater increases in the five previous years after a $10 \%$ decline in 1953. The Unclassifiable group of industries average a $2 \%$ increase over the $s i x$ preceding years.

Declines in the value of new orders in January 1959, as compared to December 1958, were as follows: The Motor Vehicles and Related Industries group (11\%); Durable Consumers' Goods group (8\%); Construction Goods group (7\%); Perishable Consumers' Goods group (5\%); and the Intermediate Goods and Supplies group ( $3 \%$ ). The decline in the Motor Vehicles and Related Industries group has followed a pattem of progressively smaller increases from 1954 to $1956(16 \%, 8 \%$, and $7 \%$, respectively) and progressively greater decreases from 1957 to 1959 ( $4 \%, 8 \%$ and $11 \%$, respectively). The Durable Consumers' Goods group follows too erratic a pattern over the previous six years to establish a trend. The decrease in the Construction Goods group is less than the decrease occurring in 1958 ( $8 \%$ ) but greater than the $5 \%$ and $2 \%$ decreases in 1954 and 1955 , respectively. The remaining three of the $s i x$ previous years had increases of $1 \%, 6 \%$ and $15 \%$ (in chronological oxder) for this group. The Perishable Consumers' Goods group has always shown a decrease in January of the six preceding years in the range of $5 \%$ to $17 \%$. During the same years, the Intermediate Goods and Supplies group has followed a mixed pattern in the range of a $25 \%$ decrease to a $23 \%$ increase in the value of new orders.

There was little change in all groups in the value of unfilled orders from December 1958 to January 1959, with the one exception being a $4 \%$ increase in the Semi-Durable Consumers' Goods group. The comparison of January 1959 with January 1958, showed increases in only two groups = the Durable Consumers' Goods group ( $17 \%$ ) and the Intermediate Goods and Supplies group ( $6 \%$ ). Decreases occurring were largest in the Heavy Transportation and Equipment group (31\%) and the construction Goods group (21\%). The remaining groups were down by percentages ranging from $3 \%$ in the Motorvehicles and Related Industries group, to $15 \%$ for Capital Goods (other than Heavy Transportation).

Trading Outlets: January sales from Manufacturers" Trading Outleta at $\$ 236,559,000$ were about $10 \%$ below the revised December value of $\$ 263,595,000$, but about $13 \%$ above January 1958 . Faixly substantial declines in Trading Outlets sales from December to January appeared in both 1956 and 1958. All published groups shared in the 1959 decine, except the wood and Paper Industries where a $1 \%$ increase was noted.

The all industry total for Trading Outlets inventories rose $3 \%$ to $\$ 279,580,000$ in January from a revised December value of $\$ 271,679,000$. This January value is almost $2 \%$ below the similar figure for 1958 . While most published groups were increasing, December to January decreases in inventory holdings appeared in Chemical Products (9\%) and Food Products (over 2\%).

## CONCEPTS

PLANT SHIPMENTS, ORDERS, AND INVENTORIES (Tables $1,2,3,4$, and 6):
Shipments - represent an estimated projection, on a monthiy basis, of the latest available Gross Value of Factory Shipments from the annual Census of Industry. In the majority of cases, Census of Industry values include (a) sales from manufacturing plant of products made at the plant, (b) amounts received for repairs or custom work, (c) shipments of goods manufactured in the plant for further processing in another unit of the same company, and (d) shipments of finished products to manufacturers' sales branches for sale, for each establishment included. The value level used is defined as "factory selling value". Goods purchased for re-sale without further processing are not included. (1)

New Orders - This series is designed to indicate the rate at which new business is being received. It is defined as all New Orders Received during the period, at estimated selling values. Thus it covers total new orders, net of cancellations, regardless of whether the orders will be filled from stock or as a result of activity during the same month (and, therefore, will also be reported as shipments in the month received) or whether they will be added to existing backlogs.

Unfilled Orders - are defined as estimated selling value, at the end of the period stated, of orders received but not yet shipped (or treated as a sale), irrespective of work done on them or of stocks from which they can be filled. (Since progress payments are treated for this survey as sales in the month received, total unfilled orders reported each month by firms operating on a progress payments basis are reduced by the total of progress accounts for these firms.) This definition of Unfilled Orders is therefore an expression in terms of future shipments values.

Total Inventory Owned - represents the estimated book value of inventory owned by manufacturers in connection with manufacturing operations, whether held at plant or not, at the end of the period stated. It is made up of:
(a) raw materials;
(b) goods in process;
(c) finished goods of own manufacture at plant and warehouse;
(1) There are a few exceptions to the definition of Census of Industry values given above:
(i) In two industries, Sawnilis, and Slaughtering and Meat Packing, custom work is valued at the estimated selling value of the product rather than by the amounts recelved for such work.
(1i) In rine industries (Fish Processing, Veneer and Plywoods, Sawmills, Pulp and Paper, Non-Ferrous Metals, Smelting and Refining, Coke and Gas Products, Petroleum Products, and Miscellaneous Products of Petroleum and Coal) the Census of Industry values represent production of finished goods rather than shipments. For these industries the Census of Industry values are adjusted by change in finished products inventory before projection for the monthly series.
(iii) In four Industries, Fabricated and Structural Steel, Aircraft, Railroad Rolling Stock and Shipbuilding, the Census of Industry value is for "work done during the year", 1.e. production of finished goods plus change in goods-in-process inventory during the year, rather than shipments. For these industries, the Census of Industry values are also adjusted by change in finished products inventory before projection for the monthly series.

There are three industries apart from those listed under (ii) and (i1i) above, for which adjustments to Census of Industry values are made before projection for the monthly series. In the Flour Milling, Brewing and Fruit and Vegetable Preparations industries all of which are characterized by large seasonal variations, many large firms operate on fiscal year periods (which are used in census of Industry compilations) differing from the calendar year. In unusual years, the projection of census of Industry values for these industries as if they represented calendar year values could cause considerable distortion in the estimates. To avoid this, the Census of Industry values from 1954 on have been adjusted to estimated calendar year values before projection. This adjustment is based on values reported to the monthly survey.

Firms operating on long-term contracts represent a special case for the monthly series. The value levels projected are those of the Census of Industry as described in the first paragraph (except for the four industries described under ili above). However, for the monthly series, all progress recelpts on long-term contracts are included as sales in the month received, instead of the total sale being included in the month the sale is finalized. It is felt that this treatment gives a better indication of monthly activity, but it does allow possible distortion of value levels in that, for the Census of Industry value which is being projected, any final sale will be recorded in one specific year, while the monthly series may have spread this sale over more than one calendar year. Since the bulk of the value of longterm contract work falls in the four industries noted for which adjustments for work done are made in complling the Census of Industry value, this inconsistency does not affect the all-1ndustry or group totals to any great extent.
less (d) value of inventory held but not owned. This item cannot be assigned to specific components.
Since the series relates to manufacturing inventory only, the value of inventory of goods purchased for re-sale without further processing is not included.

Inventory Held but Not owned represents, as far as possible, the portion of manufacturers' total inventory holdings which are no longer owned by the reporting manufacturers because of payments made on longtem contracts as work on these progresses. This item is applicable only to the relatively few industries where long-term contracts are common, although because of the nature of the item, the value per industry is high.

Because of variations in accounting methods, there are a few cases where it is not possible to obtain values for this type of inventory - some firms treat progress receipts as sales and reduce book value of inventory as payments are received; in some of these cases they no longer have records of actual holdings above the book value level. Wherever estimates are available, these have been included, but the estimates value of inventory under this heading must be considered, to some extent, incomplete.

Total Inventory held represents the estimated total value of manufacturers' inventory holdings in connection with manufacturing operations, regardless of ownership; it differs from total dnventory owned because of the inclusion of inventory held under progress payments arrangements. It includes items (a) to (c) as shown above under total inventory owned.

Inventory Components (Raw Materials, Goods in Process, and Finished Products) are reported and compiled as on the books of each manufacturer, i.e. there has been no attempt to make definitions of components appropriate for each industry as a whole.

The inventory components are alwsys a breakdown of total inventory held, not of total inventory owned. In industries where these two items differ, due to the inclusion of inventory held but not owned (see above), it is not possible to obtain value of inventory owned by components since, where separate progress accounts are maintained, firms concerned can only state that, of total holdings, a certain amount is no longer owned by them. It is fairly obvious that the bulk of such payments apply to goods in process holdings, but due to time lags in shipments and to prepayments some of the total value of inventory held but not owned would be applicable to finished products or raw materials.

Any comparisons of shipments/inventory ratios should be made using total inventory owned, not total inventory held, since the latter includes values which have already been written off to sales. If shipments/Inventory ratios are desired using inventory components, rather than total inventory, a reasonable approximation to total inventory owned by components would be obtained by assuming that all inventory held but not owned had been included with goods in process.
Industries and Groupings - All individual industries (Table 4) and the Standard Industrial Classification groupings of industries used in Table 2, are defined according to the Standard Industrial Classification Manual.

The Economic Use groups of industries (Table 3) were designed to facilitate the analysis of trends by a grouping based on the use made of each industry's products i.e. on the main demand factors affecting each industry. In drawing up this classification, the groupings were designed to tie in with National Accounts concepts as closely as possible; as a result the three main groupings - Consumer Goods industries, Capital Goods industries, and Construction Goods industries - contain only industries producing mainly final products in each of these categories. Only industries in which substantially more than half the production is of items clearly belonging to one or other of these three specific categories, or industries in which half the production falls into one such category and the remainder is scattered over two or more other categories, were assigned to one of the main groupings. All other industries were assigned to a miscellaneous category, which was sub-divided into three further groupings of related industries - Industries Producing largely for Export, Intermediate Goods and Supplies, and Motor Vehicles and Related Industries - and an unclassifiable group. The latter groupings cut across the Economic Use criteria to some extent. For further detail on the considerations leading to the assignment of industries for these groupings, reference should be made to the December, 1955 report.

## TRADING OUTLETS SALES AND INVENTORIES (Table 5): See page 47.

SOURCES
(a) Monthly Estimates -

Coverage for the various series was as follows at the end of December, 1958:
Plants reporting plant shipments accounted for 75 per cent of the total 1957 preliminary gross value of shipments. Industries covered, either by samples of reporting firms or by valuation of physical stocks, accounted for 99 per cent of total 1957 preliminary gross value of shipments.

Plants reporting inventories accounted for 74 per cent of total 1956 Year-End plant and warehouse inventory values. Industries covered, either by samples of reporting firms or by valuation of physical stocks, accounted for 97 per cent of the 1956 Year-End total.

Plants reporting orders accounted for 73 per cent of the estimated 1956 Year-End Unfilled Orders Value. Industries covered accounted for 98 per cent of estimates total Unfilled Orders at December, 1956.

Firms reporting Trading Outlets sales and inventories accounted for $82 \%$ of the 1957 estimated total Trading Outlets sales. The proportion of estimated total inventory which they accounted for has not yet been calculated, but is probably close to the sales proportion.

## (b) Benchmark Levels -

Benchmark data for annual corrections to the three series (see Section on Methods below) are obtained as follows:

Shipments - Benchmarks for 1955 and 1956 are the final Census of Industry gross value of shipments estimates (as modified in note (1) on page 52.) for these years. Benchmarks for 1957 and later years are the preliminary Census of Industry estimates for 1957 as published in the Preliminary Statement of Manufactures, 1957 (also modified according to the note on page 52.)

Inventorles - Benchmark data are obtained from an annual Calendar Year-End survey covering all manufacturing plants with an annual production value of over $\$ 50,000$ (approximately 19,000 plants). These plants account for 95 per cent of total gross value of shipments and inflation to total is made on the basis of total shipments from the annual Census of Industry. The latest available Year-End survey values are for 1956.

Orders - Benchmark surveys for Year-End Unfilled Orders have been made for each of the years 1953 to 1956 inclusive.

The 1953 survey covered all manufacturers with an annual gross value of shipments of over $\$ 50,000$. However, in addition to lack of coverage of firms under $\$ 50,000$ (representing 5 per cent of total gross value of shipments) actual coverage was incomplere due to non-response (representing 17 per cent of g.v.s.) and to lack of value records of unfilled orders (6 per cent of g.v.s.). The total estimate was made as follows:

1.     - Unfilled Orders/shipments ratios for 7 shipments size-groups were calculated for reporting firms in every industry. Shipments values used for this purpose were those for 1952, which were the latest available at time of compilation.
2.     - Estimates for firms reporting unfilled orders but no value records were based on the Unfilled Orders/shipments ratios for firms reporting orders values in the same industry and size-group.
3.     - Estimates for the group of firms not replying to the question were based on the assumptions that (a) gross value of shipments for firms with orders backlogs and for firms with no backlogs would be in the same proportions as for the group of reporting firms in the same industry and sizegroup and (b) unfilled orders/shipments ratios for the portion of the industry thus assumed to have orders would be the same as for reporting firms in the same industry and size-group.
4. Estimates for firms under $\$ 50,000$ were made as for non-respondents, using the proportions and unfilled orders/shipments ratios of the smallest size-group for the appropriate industry.

The 1954,1955 and 1956 surveys covered 7000 manufacturing plants. These plants accounted for approximately 80 per cent of 1953 gross value of shipments. Again, coverage was incomplete due to some non-response or to lack of value records for unfllled orders. The total estimates were made by the same method as used in 1953, except that, in most cases, industries were not sub-divided into size-groups since it was found that this additional step had little effect on the final estimates. The estimated portion of the 1956 Year-end total was approximately $15 \%$.

Trading Outlets - Benchmark surveys covering annual sales and year-end inventorles were made for each of the years 1956 and 1957. Questionnaires were sent to all manufacturing companies known to operate selling outlets carrying stock apart from their plants. Response was not complete, and estimates were, therefore, made for missing coverage. The estimated portion of the 1957 total sales amounts to $12 \%$; the estimated portion is lower for inventory because in a number of cases it was possible to derive this information from other reports.

## METHODS

(a) Current Estimates

For efght series (plant shipments, raw materials, goods in process, plant finished products, inventory held but not owned, unfilled orders, trading outlets sales, and trading outlets inventories, current value estimates for each industry covered are made by applying the monthly percentage changes shown by the unweighted group of reporting firms in each industry to the latest avallable benchmark values for the same industries. Industries not covered are carried at the latest avallable benchmark levels.
(The above is subject to a few exceptions. In one industry, reporting firms are treated as a stratum sample, rather than as an unelghted group. In three industries, avallable physical data on stocks and shipments are valued using price indexes. In three industries, shipments estimates are based on employment data and price indexes.)

Total inventory held in each industry is the sum of the estimated values for raw materials, goods in process, and finished products. Total inventory owned in each industry is calculated by deducting the estimated value for inventory held but not owned from estimated total inventory held. Value of new orders in each industry is derived from estimated shipments and unfilled orders using the formula "Unfilled Orders at end of previous month plus Net New Orders during month less Shipments during month equals Unfilled Orders at end of Current month".
(b) Benchmark Revisions -

As new benchmarks become avallable, estimates for the year to which the benchmarks apply are revised as follows:

For the plant shipments series, the Census of Industry value for the year for each industry is spread by months according to the trend shown by reporting firms in the original estimate for that year.

For the trading outlets sales series, the estimated value for the year, obtained from the Annual Trading Outlets survey, for each industry is spread by months according to the trend shown by reporting firms in the original estimate for that year.

For the five basic inventory series (raw materials, goods in process, plant finished products, inventory held but not owned and trading outlets inventoty) and the unfilled orders series, where the benchark values apply to the Year-End rather than to the entire year as in the shipments series, the error in the original estmate for the year-end for each industry is assumed to have accumulated equally over all twelve months of the year (i.e., one-twelfth of the amount of the error is added to the original estimate for January; two-twelfths is added to the original estimate for February; three-twelfths to March and so on).

- The three derived sertes (total inventory held, total inventory owned, and new orders) are re-calculated on the basis of the revised data for the other six series.


## LTMITATIONS TO THE USES OF THE DATA IN THIS REPORT

(1) Data for individual industries should not be interpreted as comodity data, since very few industries produce only one commodity or only one class of commodities.
(2) Since the series are in terms of current values, changes over time may be the result of both price and volume changes. Some indication of the extent to which changes in value are due to price changes, thus isolating the physical change which has taken place, can be obtained by reference to the wholesale price index. This procedure is, however, inadequate for anything more than a general indication of trends. The main problem is that the wholesale price index is a comodity price index, while the shipments, orders, and inventory series are industry series with the possibility of changes in comodity content over time. These changes in comodity content could seriously affect the weighting pattern to be applied to price indexes considered applicable for any specific industry. In considering inventory values, turnover rates and valuation methods are other important variables which should be taken into consideration, but for which adequate data are seldom avallable.
(3) Shipments data do not necessardy represent market sales for the manufacturing universe. (a) Apart from the few exceptions as noted under (b) below they are defined (see Page 89) to include total movement of goods out of manufacturing plants (or, in some cases, divisions of plants); shipments of goods for further processing by other plants of multiple-unit companies are, therefore, included as well as shipments for sale. (b) In a few special cases, the Census of Industry values include goods-in-process change, and for these cases progress receipts on long-term contracts are included as shipments as they occur, rather than at the time sales are finalized. (c) Many manufacturers re-sell purchased goods, in addition to their sales of own products, and these re-sale items are not included.
(4) The component breakdown for inventories is on an establishment, not a commodity, basis. Since each manufacturer reports inventories as on his own books, both for the monthly and annual surveys, and since a number of industries contain plants at various stages of processing, the finished products for one plant might represent comodities which would be considered raw materials or goods in process for another plant in the same industry. The composition of each lndistry must be studied before attempting to use the component breakdown as applicable to the industry as such, rather than to the firms in the industry.
(5) For Unfilled Orders, the following reservations apply:
(a) The series, be definition, excludes plants producing entirely for stock. Since approximately $40 \%$ of manufacturing is done by such plants, the trends shown are not necessarily applicable to manufacturing in general.
(b) Since the series is defined as "unshipped" orders, rather than "unproduced" orders, there is always the probability that some of the Unfilled Orders are accounted for in inventory holdings. The reduction of unfllled orders by progress receipts eliminates to a considerable extent the effect of large goods-in-process holdings in connection with long-tern contracts, but the amount of the remaining inventory, either goods-in-process or finished products, which is held in connection with existing unfilled orders would be difficult to evaluate.
(c) The series includes total orders, not just those considered as "binding", so estimates of future shipments trends based on these may be overstated due to the possibility of cancellations.
(d) Unfilled Orders for all industries include to some extent a duplication due to the fact that orders for final products in one industry may result in orders to firms at secondary or primary stages of processing. Since the total gross value of shipments will contain the same duplication, this does not invalidate the serles for purposes of analysis. However, the total impact of any one order on future shipments levels will not necessarily be shown in the Unfilled Orders series, since at any stage an order may be filled from stock, rather than added to exist ing backlogs.
(6) The Economic-Use grouping of industries - Table 3 - The difficulties involved in classifying both commodities as such, and industries on the basis of commodities made, are sufficient to limit the usefulness of this compilation to indications of trends only. The main difficulty is that many comodities may be used for different purposes which cut across classification lines. Depending on the use made of it, the same product may be a "final" product or a component part; or a final product may be used for consumption, investment, as a supply, or in construction. A second difficulty is that the basic data for this survey are in terms of estimates for individual industries, not for comodity data. An industry is a group of establishments primarily concerned with the production of a specified product or class of products. Many establishments produce other comodities in addition to those in which they are primarily concerned, and as a result very few industries can be considered "pure" In the sense that they produce only the product or class of products implied in their title. Therefore many industries, which might fall quite clearly into specified groups on the basis of the chief use of their main products, are much less clear-cut when the additional comodities produced in the establishments concerned are considered.

In this classification, only those industries in which substantially more than half the production is of items clearly belonging to that grouping, or in which half the production is of such items and the remainder is scattered over two or more groups, were assigned to the main categories; all industries which could not be so assigned were placed in the "Unclassifiable" category. This means that the inclusion of extraneous comodities is kept to a minimum. It does not, unfortunately, do anything about the fact that each category does not necessarily include all important relevant items. The grouping that is most seriously affected by the forced exclusion of relevant items is the Durable Goods sub-group of the Consumer Goods category. It does not contain the consumer portion of the Automobile industry, and in addition, it does not include the stove portion of Heating and Cooking Apparatus (since the latter industry had to be assigned to the Unclassifiable group). On the other hand, it does include two large industries with important production of items which should not be assigned to Consumer Durables - these are the Furniture industry, which also produces office and store furniture, as well as household furniture; and the Radios and Parts industry which also produces electronic equipment. The sub-category "Other Capital Goods Industries" contains the highest proportion of industries in which only about half of total production actually should be assigned to the specific grouping, but where the remainder of production is dispersed over a number of other groupings. It is, however, felt that this dispersion is not so likely to result in distortion as is possible with the large specific items involved in the Consumers' Durable Goods group.
