## TREND SUMMARY

Manufacturers' shipments in November were valued at an estimated \$2,312.2 million which is slightly lower, $1.6 \%$, than the revised value of shipments in October of $\$ 2,350.8$ million. It is, however, 7.6 per cent higher than the value of shipments in the corresponding month in 1961. The seasonally adjusted values for November show shipments higher than usual in this month with an increase of nearly two per cent over October and nearly eight per cent as compared with the previous year.

The steady rise in manufacturers' shipments which began in March 1961 following three years of relatively unchanging values shows up very sharply in the cumulative shipments in this year; the increase in the last nine months of 1961 although sharper than in any period in 1962 was obscured in the cumulative values because of the declines in the first quarter. Shipments in the past eleven months this year are eight per cent higher than in the corresponding months in 1961; comparing the past four years with 1958, for the first eleven months of each year, shipments in 1959 and 1960 were five per cent higher in each year, shipments in 1961 were seven per cent higher than 1958 while shipments in this past year are 16 per cent above the 1958 level. The plateau is even more marked in the durable goods industries than in the non-durable goods industries; in the former shipments were a steady seven per cent higher in each of the three years 1959 to 1961 as compared with 1958 and have been 20 per cent higher in this past eleven months. In the non-durable goods industries shipments moved very slowly upward; they were 3.5 per cent higher in the first eleven months of 1959 as compared with the comparable period in 1958, 4.5 per cent higher in 1960 and eight per cent higher in 1961. This past eleven months are running 14 per cent above 1958 shipments, an increase of 5.5 per cent in this year as compared with last.

The sharp increase in shipments in the durable goods industries shows up also in the ratio of finished products inventories to shipments where levels in November in five of the six durable goods industry groups are very much below normal levels and in four of them, wood products industries, iron and steel products, transportation equipment and non metalic minerals are well below the yearly average for the eleven month period. The ratio of finished goods inventory to shipments in the electrical apparatus and supplies industries is usually at its lowest level in the late fall, as it is this year, and, while the ratio during this year has not reached as high a point as in the opening months of 1961 , the average is not significantly lower.

Inventories owned by manufacturers' at the end of November were valued at an estimated $\$ 4,594.0$ million, fractionally higher than the $\$ 4,590.4$ million reported at the end of October and five per cent higher than the level at the end of November 1961 of $\$ 4,376.3$ million. Since inventories held under progress payments arrange-
ments fell by more than four per cent between October and November the level of total inventories held was fractionally lower, at $\$ 4,869.4$ million, than at the end of October when it was $\$ 4,878.3 \mathrm{million}$.

The only component in inventories held to show an increase between October and November was raw materials which was 0.7 per cent higher; this increase however was slightly less than usual for November as the seasonally adjusted series shows a slight decline. Changes in raw materials inventories were fairly small in most of the industry groups except for the food industries; the durable goods industries registered a very slight decline and non-durable goods industries an increase of $\$ 16.4$ miliion or 1.3 per cent of which $\$ 14.6 \mathrm{million}$ an increase of four per cent in this group was in the food group.

Goods in process inventories were lower at the end of November than at the end of October this year but appear to be significantly higher than at the end of November 1961. In fact the level of goods in process inventory since the end of September has been at the level reached in the second quarter of 1957 and not attained since.

Unfilled orders on books at the end of November altho' fractionally lower than at the end of October and lower than normal for November have been running at a consistently higher level in the past year than in 1961 and indeed since the middle of 1960.

## CONCEPTS

Shipments - (Tables 1 to 5) - represent an estimated projection, on a monthly basis, of the latest available Census of Industry values.

New Orders - (Tables 2 to 5 ) This series in designed to indicate the rate at which new business is being received. It is defined as all New Orders Received during the period, at estimated selling values. Thus it covers total new orders, net af cancellations, regardless of whether the orders will be filled from stock or as a result of activity during the same month (and, therefore, will also be reported as shipments in the month received) or whether they will be added to existing backlogs

Unfilled Orders - (Tables 2 co 5) - are defined at estimated selling value, at the end of the period stated, of orders received but not yet shipped (or treated as a sale), irrespective of work done on them or of stocks from which they can be fllled.

Total Inventory Owned - (Tables 2 to 5) - represents the estimated book value of inventory owned by manufacturers in connection with manufacturing operations, wherher held at plant or not, at the end of the period stated. It is made up of raw materials, goods in process, finished goods of own manufacture at plant and warehouse, less value of inventory held but not owned which cannot be assigned to specific componencs. Since the series relates to manufacturing inventory only, value of goods purchased for re-sale is not included.

Inventory Held but Not Owned - (Tables 2 to 5) - represents, as far as possible, the portion of manufacturers' total inventory holdings which are no longer owned by the reporting manufacturers because of payments made on long-term contracts as work on these progresses. This item is applicable only co the relatively few industries where long-term contracts are common although, because of the nature of the item, the value per industry is high.

Becsuse of variations in accounting methods there are a few cases where it is not possible to obtain values for this type of inventory. The estimated value shown for this item must therefore be considered to some extent incomplete.

Total Inventory Held - (Tables 2 to 5) - represents the estimated total value of manufacturers inventory holdings in connection with manufacturing operations, regardless of ownership; it differs from inventory owned by the inclusion of amount held under progress payments arrangements.

Inventory Components - (Tables 2 to 5) - (Raw Materials, Goods in Process, and Finished Products) are reparted and campiled as on the books of each manufacturer, i. e. there has been no attempt to define the components specifically for each induatry.

The inventory components are always a breakdown of total inventory held, not of total inventory owned. In industries where these two items differ, due to the inclusion of inventory held but not owned (see above), it is not possible to obtain value of inventory owned by components since, where separate progress accounts are maintained, firms concerned can only state that, of cotal holdings, a certain amount is no longer owned by them. It is fairly obvious that the bulk of such payments apply to goods in process holdings but due to time lags in shipments and to prepayments some of the total value of inventory held but not owned would be applicable to finished products or raw materials.

Any comparisons of shipments/inventory ratios should be made uaing tatal inventory owned, not total inventory held, Bince the latter includes values which have already been written off to sales. If shipmenta inventory ratios are desired using inventory components, rather chan total inventory, a reasonable approximation to total inventory owned by components would be obtained by assuming that all inventory held but not owned had been included with goods in process.

Trading Outlets - (Table 7) - are defined as any establishments (other than retail stores) operated by manufacturers, apart from their plants or plant-warehouges, which carry stocks and make gales direct co customers. Sales offices which merely arrange sales but do not carry stock, or which carry small quantities only for demonstration purposes, are not included. Sales for this series represent direct asles from the outlet of goods manufactured by the owning or associated manufacturing company, with sales arranged by outlets but shlpped direct from plant excluded wherever possible; goods purchased for re-sale from sources other than the owning or associated manufacturing company are also excluded except for the Petroleum Products industry group where a geparation of purchased products is not feasible. Inventories for this series represents owned inventories held at Trading Outlets or in warehouses serving the trading outlets; again, goods purchased for re-sale are excluded except for the Petroleum Products industry.

Industries and Groupings - All individusl industries (Table 5) and the Standard Industrial Classification groupings of industries used in Tables 3,6 and 7 , are defined according to the Standard Industrial Clasaificstion Manual. A list of the industries included in the Standard Industrial Classification groups and in the Economic-Use groupings of industries (Tables 4 , and 6) will be found on page 53 of the bulletin.

## SOURCES

Monthly (or, in a few cases, quarterly) reports covering value of inventories and shipments are now submitted an a voluntary basia by 3,000 plants in 120 industries; in addition, 3,000 small plants in 100 of these industries report monthly shipments only. of the first group, 1,025 plants in 83 industries also report new and unflled orders. Four indugtries are included in the total shipments eatimates by using data available from other Bureau geries, and two of these are also included in the total inventory estimates.
