ESTIMATED VALUES OF SHIPMENTS, INVENTORY OWNED, AND ORDERS IN ALL MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES


Manufacturers' shipments in July were valued at an estimated $\$ 2,174.4$ million which is 5.3 per cent lower than the revised June estimate of $\$ 2,295.7$ million but 11.4 per cent higher than July shipments a year ago which are estimated at $\$ 1,952.4$ million.

The decline in shipments in July is seasonal and is less than usual since the seasonally adjusted value, at $\$ 2,247.0$ million, is 4.3 per cent higher than the revised June estimate of $\$ 2,154.2$ million; it is also 10.9 per cent higher than the estimated value of shipments in July last year of $\$ 2,027.0$ million and is in fact at the highest level yet reached.

The durable goods industries, led by the automotive group, showed a sharper decline this month than the non-durable group. The decline in automobile shipments this summer has been less than usual however and total shipments in the first seven months have been the highest on record running $\$ 200$ million above shipments in the comparable periods in 1960 and 1956.

Shipments in the construction goods industries moved up to peak levels in May and June this year and although July shipments dropped about 3 per cent from June the value of shipments for the first seven months is nearly 12 per cent higher than shipments in the same period last year. The previous peak year in these industries was in 1959 and shipments this year are running 5 per cent higher than in that year.

In the non-durable goods industries the decline in July of 2.7 per cent following the slight 1.1 per cent decline in June as compared with May, still leaves the shipments in these industries for the first seven months in 19626.7 per cent above the comparable period in 1961.

None of the non-durable industry groups showed any unusual changes in July except perhaps the clothing industries where shipments were up by 11 per cent as compared with June. Shipments in the food industries, which make up a third of total non-durable goods, were at the same level in July as June.

The slight increase in unfilled orders on books at the end of July is not in itself sufficient to indicate an expansion in manufacturing activity but together with the upward revision in the level at the end of June it does bring the level of unfilled orders up to the level which prevalled in 1959 . If the unfilled orders in the transportation equipment industries, S.I.C. 11, are considered separately and excluded from the total, unfilled orders in manufacturing show a steady increase from the middle of 1961 reaching a level this sumner comparable with that at the beginning of 1958 . Unfllled orders in S.T.C. 11 have dropped to half the level they were at the beginning of 1958 , reflecting the drop in new orders for aircraft and ships.

Inventories owned by manufacturers at the end of July were estimated at $\$ 4,463.9$ million a decrease of 0.3 per cent from the revised June total of $\$ 4,478.0$ million; inventories held by manufacturers were fractionally higher at the end of July, $\$ 4,755.4$ million as compared with inventories held at the end of June of $\$ 4,754.3$ million. The difference indicates an increase in inventory held under progress payments arrangements which amounted to $\$ 15$ million.

Although the shift in the components of inventory held during July is insignificant compared with the end of June the shift over the year is interesting. Finished products inventory is up by over 5 per cent and raw materials inventory by nearly 4 per cent with goods in process up by 15 per cent. Inventory held under progress payments undoubtedly contributes heavily to this increase in goods in process as inventory held under progress payments is over 40 per cent higher at the end of July this year as compared with last.

The increase in finished goods inventory is less than the increase in shipments as compared with July a year ago as the ratio of finished products inventory to shipments is lower, at 0.68 , than it was last year at 0.71 . As compared with June, however, both finished goods and total inventory ratios to shipments have moved up.

Although all the industry groups with the exception of S.I.C. groups 8, paper products and 14 , non-metallic mineral products show increases in inventory holdings this month as compared with a year ago, five groups have quite substantial increases. These are the rubber, leather and textile products industries, the electrical apparatus and supplies industries and the petroleum and petroleum products industries. There are fairly wide differences between the shipments and inventory patterns in these groups but it would appear as if the rubber, textile products and electrical apparatus and supplies industries are operating at a significantly higher level: shipments are up substantially, unfilled orders in the textile products and the electrical apparatus industries are much higher and inventories are higher in all three components in each group. The inventory shipments ratios are lower in July for both total inventory and finished goods inventory for textiles and electrical apparatus although higher for total inventory in the rubber products industries.

Inventories in the leather products group are higher, up 7 per cent this July as compared with a year ago, and have been running at a higher level all year too but the inventories shipments ratio has gone up since shipments have been running 6 per cent above last year.

Inventories in the electrical apparatus and supplies group are up and substantially, 12.5 per cent, in total but within this rise there has also been a considerable shift in components. Goods in process inventories now account for approximately 40 per cent of inventory holdings, an upward shift of about 5 per cent during the past four years. During the same period, inventory held under progress payments has dropped to about a third of what it was in 1958.

## CONCEPTS

Shipments - (Tables 1 to 5) - represent an estimated projection, on a monthly basis, of the latest available Census of Industry values.

New Orders - (Tables 2 to 5 ) . This sexies is designed to indicate the rate at which new business is being received. It is defined as all New Orders Received during the period, at estimated selling values. Thus it covers total new orders, net of cancellations, regardless of whether the orders will be Eilled from stock or as a result of activity during the same month (and, therefore, will also be reported as shipments in the month received) or whether they will be added to existing backlogs.

Unfilled Orders - (Tables 2 to 5 ) - are defined at estimated selling value, at the end of the period stated, of orders received but not yet shipped (or treated as a sale), irrespective of work done on ther or of stocks from which they can be filled.

Total Inventory Owned - (Tables 2 to 5) - represents the estimated book value of inventory owned by manufacturers in conmection with manufacturing operations, whether held at plant or not, at the end of the period stated. It is made up of: raw materials, goods in process, Einished goods of own manufacture at plant and warehouse, less value of inventory held but not owned which cannot be assigned to specific components. Since the series relates to manufacturing inventory only, value of goods purchased for re-sale is not included.

Inventory Held but Not Dwned - (Tables 2 to 5) - represents, as far as possible, the portion of manufacturers' total inventory holdings which are no longer owned by the reporting manufacturers because of payments made on long-term contracts as work on these progresses. This item is applicable only to the relatively few industries where long-term contracts are comon although, because of the nature of the item, the value per industry is high.

Because of variations in accounting methods there are a few cases where it is not possible to obtain values for this type of inventory. The estimated value shown for this item must therefore be considered to some extent incomplete.

Total Inventory Held - (Tables 2 to 5) - represents the estimated total value of manufacturers' inventory holdings in connection with manufacturing operations, regardless of ownership; it differs from inventory owned by the inclusion of amounts held under progress payments arxangements.

Inventory Components - (Tables 2 to 5) - (Raw Materials, Goods in process, and Finished Products) are reported and compiled as on the books of each manufacturer, i.e. there has been no attempt to deffer the components specifically for each industry.

The inventory components are always a breakdown of total inventory held, not of total inventory owned. In industries where these two items differ, due to the inclusion of inventory held but not owned (see above), it is not possible to obtain value of inventory oned by components since, where separate progress accounts are maintained, firms concerned can only state that, of total holdings, a certain amount is no longer owned by them. It is fairly obvious that the bulk of such payments apply to goods in process holdings but due to time lags in shipments and to prepayments some of the total value of inventory held but not owned would be applicable to finished products or raw materials.

Any comparisons of shipments/inventory ratios should be made using total inventory owned, not total inventory held, since the latter includes values which have already been written off to sales. If shipaents inventory ratios are desired using inventory components, rather than total inventory, a reasonable approximation to total inventory owned by components would be obtained by assuming that all inventory held but not onned had been included with goods in process.

Trading Outlets - (Table 7) - are defined as any establishments (other than retail stores) operated by manufacturers, apart from their plants or plant-warehouses, which carry stocks and make sales direct to customers. Sales offices which merely arrange sales but do not carry stack, or which carry small quantities only for demonstration purposes, are not included. Sales for this series represent direct sales Erom the outlet of goods manufactured by the owning or associated manufacturing company, with sales arranged by outlets but shipped direct Erom piant excluded wherever possible; goods purchased for re-sale from sources other than the owning or associated manufacturing company are also excluded except for the Petroleum Products industry group where a separation of purchased products is not feasible. Inventories for this series represents owned inventories held at Trading Outlets or in warehouses serving the trading outlets; again, goods purchased for re-sale are excluded except for the Petroleum Products industry.

Industries and Groupings - All individual industries (Table 5) and the Standard Industrial Classification groupings of industries used in Tables 3,6 and 7 , are defined according to the Standard Industrial Classificstion Manual. A list of the industries included in the Standard Industrial Classification groups and in the Economic-Use groupings of industries (Tables 4 , and 6) will be found on page 53 of che bulletin.

## SOURCES

Monthly (or, in a few cases, quarterly) reports covering value of inventories and shipments are now submitted on a voluntary basis by 3,000 plants in 120 industries; in addition, 3,000 small plants in 100 of these industries report monthly shipments only. Of the first group, 1,025 plants in B3 industries alao report new and unfilled orders. Four industries are included in the total shipments estimates by using data available from other bureau serfes, and two of these are also included in the total inventory estimates.
