## TREND SUMMARY


#### Abstract

Manufacturers' shipments in September were valued at an estimated $\$ 2,218.5$ million bringing total shipments in the third quarter of the year to $\$ 6,505.3$ million as compared with $\$ 6,163.4$ million in the third quarter of 1961. The higher level of shipments this quarter is 5.5 per cent above shipments in 1961 as compared with a level 9.5 per cent higher in the first quarter and 9.8 per cent higher in the second. The decline in comparative values not only reflects the decline in July and August shipments this year but also reflects the increase in shipments in 1961 which began in March and carried through into November with seasonal declines in April and July.


#### Abstract

If the shipments values are compared after adjustment for seasonal variation the first large decline in the steady upward trend occurred in August of this year. The usual decline in July was less than expected and the recovery in August was lower. Since the largest declines were shown in the motor vehicle, clothing and the construction goods industries it may reflect a shifting seasonal pattern but is more likely the result of different factors depending on the industry. Shipments in the automotive industries had been running nearly one third higher than the previous year until August when they dropped back to 14 per cent higher but the decline in this one month does not appear significant as shipments are up again in September by 20 per cent over last year and the cumulative value for 1962 is 29.6 more than in the previous year. The construction goods industries fell off both in April and July which again may be seasonal or it may, in July, reflect the tighter money situation which prevailed during the summer from the increase in the bank rate in June. Shipments in the clothing industry have been running between three and six per cent above last year, at a much lower level comparatively than shipments in textiles, at 8 to 11 per cent higher, and also lower than shipments in the leather and rubber products industries. The higher level of shipments in the textile industries may reflect the growing trend toward carpeting and the heavy demands here for apartment and office building use.


Inventories owned and inventories held by manufacturers at the end of September at $\$ 4,558.5$ million and $\$ 4,850.5$ million respectively were both 0.4 per cent higher than the revised estimates of $\$ 4,541.3$ million and $\$ 4,831.2$ million at the end of August. Inventories held increased significantly more, 7.9 per cent, than inventories owned, 6.4 per cent, over the level at September 1961 as a result of the vexy large increase in inventories held under progress payments arrangements. Inventories held under progress payment at the end of September at 292 million have risen 40 per cent in the last year with the increase concentrated in the second quarter of this year. The increase is largely in the heavy transportation industries with some in the construction industries.

The upward movement in manufacturing inventories which began in July 1961 has, when considered in the seasonally adjusted sexies for inventories held, shown an unusually smooth upward climb. The total increase from June 1961 to the end of September is nine per cent with the greatest increase being shown in this quarter, with a three per cent rise. Only one other quarter has approached this and that was the fourth quarter of 1961 when inventories at the end of December wexe 2.4 per cent higher than at the end of September that year. In each of the remaining quarters the increase was one per cent or only slightly more.

The smoothness in the series derives largely from the trend in raw materials although it also reflects the divergent but compensating movements of the three components. The decline in raw materials inventory in January and February this year was offset by the increase in goods in process inventory; the slower rate of increase in inventories in the second quarter reflects the decline in finished goods inventory during this time.

The ratio of finished goods inventory to shipments turned up in August this year in comparison with the ratio in 1961 and was higher again in September at 0.66 as compared with 0.65 . The average quarterly ratio was 4.0 points lower in the first quarter, 3.7 points lower in the second and 0.3 points higher in the third quarter this year as compared with last.

The decline in unfilled orders in September was general with the exception of the automotive industries where the rise, 3.1 per cent was exactly equal to the total decline. The decline is, however much less than usually shown in September for the seasonally adjusted series a decline of less
than one per cent from August. The level as compared with September 1961 is nearly 10 per cent higher in both the seasonally adjusted and the unadjusted series.

The month to month change in the level of unfilled orders has been somewhat less regular in the motor vehicles and related industries group this year as compared with other years and the increase this month is quite unusual as unfilled orders in September normally remain at the August level or show a decline. The decline in unfilled orders in the construction industry however appears to be following the regular movement downard which begins in the late summer each year. The increase in unfilled orders in March this year was somewhat unusual and although unfilled orders have been significantly higher than in 1961 during this year they have fallen off somewhat since July.

## CONCEPTS

Shipments - (Tablea 1 to 5) - represent an estimated projection, on a monthly basia, of the latest available Census of Industry values.

New Orders - (Tables 2 to 5) - This series is designed to indicate the rate at which new business is being received. It is defined as all New Orders Received duriog the period, at estimated selling valuea. Thus it covers total new orders, net of cancellations, regardleas of whether the orders will be filled from stock or as a result of activity during the same month (and, therefore, will also be reported as shipments in the month received) or whether they will be added to existing backlogs.

Unfilled Orders - (Tables 2 to 5) - are defined at estimated selling value, at the end of the period stated, of orders received but not yet shipped (or treated as a sale), irrespective of work done on them or of stocks from which they can be filled.

Tatal Inventory Owned - (Tables 2 to 5) - represents che estimated book value of inventary owned by manufacturers in connection with manufacturing operations, whether held at plant or not, at the end of the period stated. It is made up of: raw materials, goods in process, finished goods of own manafacture at plant and warehouse, less value of inventory held but not owned which cannot be assigned to specific components. Since the series relates to manufacturing inventory only, value of goods purchased for re-sale is not included.

Inventory Held but Not Owned - (Tables 2 to 5) - represents, as far as posaible, the portion of manufacturers' total inventory holdings which are no longer owned by the reporting manufacturers because of payments made on long-term contracts as work on these progresses. This item is applicable only to the relatively fewindustries where long-term contracts are conmon although, because of the nature of the item, the value per industry is high.

Because of variations in accounting methods there are few cases where it is not possible to obtain values for this type of inventory. The estimated value shown for this item must therefore be considered to some extent incomplete.

Total Inventory Held - (Tables 2 to 5) - represents the estimated total value of manufacturera' inventory holdings in connection with manufacturing operations, regardless of omership; it differs from inventory owned by the inclusion of amounts held under progress payments arrangements.

Inventory Componencs - (Tables 2 to 5) - (Raw Materials, Goods in Process, and Finished Products) are reported and compiled as on the books of each manufacturer, i.e. there has been no attempt to define the components specifically for each industry.

The inventory components are always a breakdown of total inventory held, not of total inventory owned. In industries where these two items differ, due to the inclusion of inventory held but not owned (see above), it is not possible to obtain value of inventory owned by components since, where separate progress accounts are maintained, firms concemed can only state that, of total holdings, a certain amount is no longer owned by them. It is fairly obvious that the bulk of such payments apply to goods in process holdings but due to time lags in shipments and to prepayments some of the total value of inventory held but not owned would be applicable to finished products or raw materials.

Any comparisons of shipments/inventory ratios should be made using total inventory owned, not total inventory held, since the latter includes values which have already been written off to sales. If shipments inventory ratios are desired using inventory components, rather than total inventory, a reasonable approximation to total inventory owned by components would be obtained by assuming that all inventory held but not owned had been included with goods in process.

Trading Outlets - (Table 7) = are defined as any establishments (other than retail stores) operated by manufacturers, apart from their plants or plant-warehouses, which carry stocks and make sales direct to customers. Sales offices which merely arrange sales but do not carry stock, or which carry small quantities only for demonstation purposes, are not included. Sales for this series represent direct sales from the outlet of goods manufactured by the owning or associated manufacturing company, with sales arranged by outlets but shipped direct from plant excluded wherever possible; goods purchased for re-sale from sources other than the owning or associated manufacturing company are also excluded except for the Petroleum Products industry group where separation of purchased products is not feasible. Inventories for this series represents owned inventorles held at Trading outlets or in warehouses serving the trading outlets; again, goods purchased for re-sale are excluded except for the Petroleum Producta industry.

Industries and Groupings - All Individual industries (Table 5) and the Standard Industrial Classification groupings of Industries used in Tables 3, 6 and 7, are defined according to the Standard Industrial Classification Manual. A list of the industries included in the Standard Industrial Classification groups and in the Economic-Use groupings of industries (Tables 4 , and 6) will be found on page 53 of the bulletin.

## SOURCES

Monthly (or, in a few cases, quarterly) reports covering value of inventories and shipments are now submitted on a voluntary basis by 3,000 plants in 120 industries; in addition, 3,000 swall plants in 100 of these industries report monthly shipments only. Of the first group, 1,025 plants in 83 industries also report new and unfilled orders. Four industies are included in the total shipments estimates by using data available from other Bureau series, and two of these are also included in the total inventory estimates.
