## AUGUST SUMMARY

The sharp drop in manufacturers' shipments in the transportation equipment industries, in August, to just over half the level in July would appear to be the reason behind the general August deciine. Certainly it explains the drop in shipments in Ontario manufacturing as compared with the other provinces where shipments were either higher than in July or only slightly lower as in Nova Scotia and British Columbia. However, the summer decline in the automobile industry is a well established seasonal fact and the seasonally adjusted series of manufacturers' shipments shows a decline of over four per cent. Thus the usual seasonal increase in other manufacturing activity would appear to be significantly less than usual.

In the durable goods industries one other group showed a significant decline in shipments, the machinery industry, where shipments in August were only seventysix per cent of the July value. Two of the other durable goods industry groups, wood industries and the furniture and fixtures industries, showed increases, two showed declines, the electrical products industries and the non-metallic mineral products industries; shipments from the primary metals industries remained at the July level. For these groups combined August shipments were fractionally higher than shipments in July in contrast to the two previous years when shipments were six per cent and eleven per cent higher respectively in August as compared with July.

The non-durable goods group of industries, as a whole, showed an increase of only two and one-half per cent, the smallest increase since 1959. There were slight declines in shipments in the foods and beverages industries, and in the tobacco, rubber and petroleum industries; shipments were slightly higher in the textiles and knitting mills industries, paper and in the chemical and chemical products industries. The leather, clothing and miscellaneous manufacturing industries showed rather large increases in shipments in August as compared with July.

Manufacturers' inventories, seasonally adjusted, remained stationary during August; total inventory held being exactly level, reflecting a fractional decline in raw materlals stocks and a fractional increase in finished products. The increase in the unadjusted data is concentrated in the durable goods group as the non durable industries in total are almost unchanged with fractional increases in the raw matterials and goods in process and a slight decline in finished products.

None of the industry groups show unusual movement this month; stocks of foods and beverages show a slight increase which may be expected to continue through September and then build up more sharply during the fourth quarter. The textile and clothing industries show declines this month following the usual build up of stocks from March. This year the peak was reached earlier, in April, and was neither as high nor as sharp an increase as last year's although very comparable with that in 1961. Stocks of finished products declined slightly in the wood and paper and allied industries and in the furniture and fixture industries. In the primary metal industries finished goods stocks increased slightly in contrast to the usual two to three per cent decline in August; the shift reflects directly the change in shipments which were only slightly higher than in July this year rather than considerably higher. The decline in the metal fabricating industries stocks of finished goods was also less than usual and the increase in shipments very much less.

The decline in shipments in the transportation equipment industries and in the machinery industries has already been noted. The decline in the transportation equipment industries being an annual predictable event was not accompanied by a large increase in finished stocks. Finished stocks did go up slightly but the increase in total inventory in these industries was largely in goods in process and to some extent in raw materials. The decline in shipments in the machinery industries was accompanied by a slight decline in finished stocks, goods in process inventories remained level but at the low point to which they had dropped the previous month.

## CONCEPTS

Shipments - (Tables 1 to 4) - represent an estimated projection, on monthly basis, of the latest available Census of Manufactures values.

New Orders - (Tables 2 and 3) - This sexies is designed to indicate the rate ar which new business is being received. It is defined as all New Orders Received during the period, at estimated selling values. Thus it covers total new orders, net of cancellations, regardless of whether che orders will be filled from scock or as a result of activicy during the same month (and, therefore, will also be reporced as shipmencs in the month received) or whecher they will be added to exiscing backlogs.

Unfilled Orders - (Tables 2 and 3) - are defined at estimated selling value, at the end of the perlod stated, of orders received but not yet shipped (or treaced as a sale). irrespective of work done on them or of stocks from which chey can be fllled.

Total Imventory Owned - (Tables 2 co 4) - represencs the estimaced book value of inventory owned by manufacturers in connection with manufacturing operations, whether held at plant or not, at the end of the period stated. It is made up of: raw materials, goods in process, finished goods of own manufacture at plant and warehouse, less value of inventory held but not owned which cannot be assigned to specific components. Since the series relates to manufacturing inventory only, value of goods purchased for re-sale is not included.

Inventory Held but Not Owned - (Tables 2 and 3) - represents, as far as possible, the portion of manufacturers' total in ventory holdings which are no longer owned by the reporting manufacturers because of payments made on long-cerm contracts as work on chese progresses. This item is applicable only lo the relatively few industries where long-term contracts are common although, because of the nature of the item, the value per industry is high.

Because of variations in accounting mechods chere are a few cases where it is not possible to obtain values for this type of inventory. The estimated value shown for this item must cherefore be considered co some extent incomplete.

Total Inventory Held - (Tables 2 and 3) - represents the estimated cotal value of manufacturers inventory holdings in connection with manufacturing operations, regardless of ownership; it differs from inventory owned by che inclusion of amounts held under progress payments arrangements.

Inventory Components - (Tables 2 and 3) - Raw Materials, Goods in Process, and Finished Products are reported and compiled as on the books of each manufacturer, 1 . e. there has been no atrempt to define the componenes specifically for each industry.

The invencory components are always a breakdown of total inventory held, not of cotal inventory owned. In industries where these two items differ, due to the inclusion of inventory held but not owned (see above), it is not possible co obtain value of inventory owned by components since, where separace progress accounts are maincained, firms concerned cari only state that, of total holdings, a certain amount is no longer owned by them. It is fairly obvious that the bulk of such payments apply to goods in process holdings but due co time lags in shipments and to prepayments some of the total value of inventory held but not owned would be applicable to finished products or raw materials.

Any comparisons of shipments/imentory ratios should be made using cotal imventory owned, not cotal inventory held, since the latter includes values which have already been written off to sales. If shipments/iaventory ratios are desired usimg inventory components, rather than cotal imventory, a reasonable approximation to total imventory owned by components would be obtained by assuming that all imventory held but not owned had been included with goods in process.

Groupings - The Standard Induserial Classification groupings of industries used in Tables 3 and 4 are defined according to the Standard Industrial Classification Manual. A list of the industries included in the Standard Industrial Classification groups will be found on page 27 of the bullecin.

## SOURCES

Monthly (or, in a few cases, quarterly) reports covering value of inventories and shipments are now submitted on a voluncary basis by 3,000 plants in 120 induscries; in addition, 3,000 small plants in 100 of these industries report monthly shipmenta only. Of the first group, 1,025 plants in 83 industries also report new and unfilled orders. Four industries are included in the total shipments escimaces by using data available from other Bureau series, and two of these are also included in the total inventory estimates.
