## TREND SUMMARY

Manufacturers' shipments in October were valued at an estimated $\$ 2,710.0$ million, a decrease of $1.1 \%$ from the revised September estimate of $\$ 2,738.9$ million, but an increase of $2.1 \%$ from the October 1963 estimate of $\$ 2,655.3$ million. Shipments in the January-October period were valued at an estimated $\$ 25,838.7$ million, an increase of $7.9 \%$ from the corresponding 1963 estimate of $\$ 23,943.4$ million.

Since shipments in October usually increase the decline in the seasonally adjusted estimate was somewhat greater; at $\$ 2,523.8$ million it was $1.9 \%$ below the September estimate of $\$ 2,571.5$ million.

The value of manufacturers' shipments increased $2.1 \%$ in October as compared to Octaber 1963, with six of the nine provinces listed sharing in the increases as follows: Nova Scotia, 14.3\%; Quebec, 3.4\%; Ontario, 1.3\%; Alberta, 3.7\%; and British Columbia, 5.1\%. Newfoundland, New Brunswick and Manitoba recorded declines of $6.4 \%$, $7.1 \%$ and $7.7 \%$ respectively while Saskatchewan remained practically unchanged with a fractional increase.

The increase in October 1964 as compared to the same month last year in Nova Scotia was due to higher shipments values in the foods and beverages, wood, transportation equipment and petroleum products industries; in Quebec to advances in the foods and beverages, primary metals, transportation equipment, electrical and nonmetallic mineral products industries; in Ontario to increases in the foods and beverages, paper, primary and fabricated metals and machinery industries; in Alberta to gains in the wood, paper, primary metals and non-metallic mineral products industries; and in British Columbia to higher values in the foods and beverages and paper products industries. The decline in Newfoundland was due to lower shipments values in the foods and beverages industries; in New Brunswick to declines in the foods and beverages and wood products industries and in Manitoba to lower values in the primary and fabricated metal products industries.

Total inventory owned by manufacturers in October was estimated at $\$ 5,068.5$ million, down $0.4 \%$ from the revised September estimate of $\$ 5,089.4$ million but up $4.8 \%$ from the October 1963 est imate of $\$ 4,834.2$ million. Total inventory held by manufacturers, estimated at $\$ 5,345.6$ million, showed a slight decrease of $0.3 \%$ from the revised September estimate of $\$ 5,361.5$ million but increased by $4.5 \%$ from the October 1963 estimate of $\$ 5,116.7 \mathrm{million}$. The ratio of total inventory owned-toshipments was 1.87 in October, 1.86 in September and 1.82 in October 1963. The ratio of finished products-to-shipments remained constant at 0.64 in October, September and October 1963.

The seasonally adjusted estimates of the inventory series at the end of October show a slight decline in total inventory held, at $\$ 5,373.0$ million from $\$ 5,391.3$ million at the end of September with the decline concentrated in stocks of finished products, which fell to $\$ 1,785.0$ million from $\$ 1,807.8$ million, and a small decline in raw material stocks. Goods in process inventory, on the other hand, rose by $1.6 \%$ from $\$ 1,338.1$ million at the end of September to $\$ 1,358.9$ million at the end of October.

New orders in October at an estimated $\$ 2,740.6$ million increased by $1.2 \%$ over the revised September estimate of $\$ 2,708.2$ million, and by $3.4 \%$ over the October 1963 estimate of $\$ 2,651.6$ million. Unfilled orders for October, estimated at $\$ 2,-$ 640.3 million, were up $1.2 \%$ from the revised September estimate of $\$ 2,609.7$ million and up $13.5 \%$ from the 0 ctober 1963 estimate of $\$ 2,326.5$ million.

The seasonally adjusted estimates for both new orders and unfilled orders rose in October; the new orders rose only slightly from $\$ 2,603.2$ million in September to $\$ 2,618.7$ million in October but the level of unfilled orders was up by $3.6 \%$ at \$2,754.6 million.

## CONCEPTS

Shipments - (Tables 1 to 4) - repreaent an estimated projection, on a monthly basis, of the latest avallable Census of Manufactures values.

New Orders - (Tables 2 and 3) - This series is designed co indicate the rate at which new business is being received. It is defined as all New Orders Received during the period, at estimated selling values. Thus it covers total new orders, net of cancellations, regardless of whether the orders will be filled from stock or as a result of activity during the same month (and, therefore, will also be reported as shipments in the month recelved) or whether they will be added to existing backlogs.

Unfilled Orders - (Tables 2 and 3) - are defined as orders on books at the end of the period stated. That is, they cover orders received but not yet shipped (or treated as a sale), irrespective of work done on them or of stocks from which they can be filled

Total Inventory Owned - (Tables 2 to 4) - represents the estimated book value of inventory owned by manufacturers in cannection with the manufacturing operations of the establishment covered whether held at plant or elsewhere, at the end of the period stated. It is made up of: raw materlals, goods in process, finished goods of own manufacture less the value of inventory held but not owned which cannot be assigned to specific components. Since the series relates to manufacturing inventory only, value of goods purchased for re-sale is not included

Inventory Held but Not Owned - \{Tables 2 and 3) - represents, as far as possible, the portion of manufacturers' total inventary holdings which are no longer owned by the reporting manufacturers because of payments made on long-term contracts as work on theae progresses. This item is applicable only to the relatively few industries where long-term contracts are comon although, because of the nature of the item, the value per industry is high.

Because of variations in accounting methods there are a few cases where it is not possible to obtain values for this type of inventory. The estimated value shown for this item must therefore be considered to some extent incomplete.

Total Inventory Held - (Tables 2 and 3) - represents the estimated total value of manufacturers' Inventory holdings in connection with manufacturing operations, regardless of ownership; it differs from inventory owned by the inclusian of inventories held under progress payments arrangements.

Inventory Components - (Tables 2 and 3) - Raw Materials, Goods in Process, and Finished Products are reported and compiled as on the books of each manufacturer, i.e. there has been no attempt to define the components apecifically for each industry.

The inventory components are always a breakdown of total inventory held, not of total inventory owned. In industies where chese two items differ, due to the inclusion of inventory held but not owned (see above), it is not possible to obtain value of inventory owned by components since, where separate progress accounts are maintained, firms concerned can only state that, of total holdings, a certain amount is not longer owned by them. It is faitly obvious that the bulk of such payments apply to goods in process holdings but due to time 1 sg g in shipments and to prepayments some of the total value of inventory held but not owned would be applicable to finished products or raw materials,

Any comparisons of shipments/anventory ratios should be made using total inventory owned, not total inventory held, since the latter includes values which have already been written off ta sales. If shipments/inventory ratios are desired using inventory components, rather than total inventory, a reasamale approximation to total inventory owned by components would be obtained by assuming that all inventory held but not owned had been included with goods in process.

Groupings - The Standard Industrial Classification groupings of industries used in Tables 3 and 4 are defined according to the Standard Industrial Classification Manual. A list of the industries included in the Standard Industrial Classification groups will be found on page 40 of the bulletin.

## SOURCES

Monthly (or, in a few cases, quarterly) reports covering value of inventories and shipments are now submitted on a voluntary basis by 3,000 plants in 120 industries; in addition, 3,000 small plants in 100 of these industries report monthly shipments only. Of the first group, 1,025 plants in 83 industries also report new and unfilled orders. Four industries are included in the total shipments estimates by using data avallable from other Bureau series, and two of these are also included in the total inventory estimates.
