The preliminary estimate of shipments in manufacturing industries totaling $\$ 2,778.1$ million in April was 2.9 per cent down from the revised March value of $\$ 2,860.1$ million, but was 5.9 per cent up from the April 1964 total of $\$ 2,623.3$ million. After adjustment for seasonal varfation, the value of shipments at $\$ 2,771.0$ million was only 0.5 per cent lower than the previous month. April shipments brought the total in the first four months of the year to $\$ 10,520.6 \mathrm{milin}$, higher by 4.3 per cent than in the corresponding period a year earlier of $\$ 10,089.9$ million. April shipments in the durable goods industries declined 3.4 per cent from the level of $\$ 1,354.8 \mathrm{mll1}$ ion in March, and the non-durable goods industries dropped by 2.3 per cent to $\$ 1,470.0$ million in April.

Nearly all of the major industry groups were off from the high records of shipments obtained in March, with the greatest decline of 18.7 per cent reported by the tobacco industries, and of 12 per cent shown by the leather industries, the knitting mills, the clothing industries, and the wood industries. The small to considerable decreases occurring in most of the major industry groups were slightly offset by the small increases obtained by the machinery industries of 5 per cent, the rubber industries and the primary metal industries of 2 per cent, and the foods and beverages and the paper and allied industries of 0.5 per cent. In comparison with the corresponding month in 1964, however, all industries had somewhat higher shipments in April except the tobacco industries and the leather industries.

New orders received during the month of April reached $\$ 2,795.9$ million, 5.9 per cent lower than the all-time peak of $\$ 2,970.2$ million recorded in March, but 5.6 per cent higher than in the same month in 1964.

The backlog of unfilled orders at the end of April rose 0.6 per cent to $\$ 3,040.4$ million from $\$ 3,022.6$ million in March; seasonally adjusted, unfilled orders were up by 1.9 per cent in April. As compared with the April value a year earlier, this increment in April 1965 brings the level up to 18.1 per cent or to 18.5 per cent, seasonally adjusted.

At the end of April, manufacturers inventories owned totalled \$5,328.9 million, a very slight increase of 0.04 per cent from the month earlier, but 7.1 per cent higher than April a year ago. After allowance for seasonal variation, inventories owned and total inventories held showed increases of 0.4 per cent and 0.2 per cent respectively over the previous month; the small April accumulation of inventories occurred entirely in goods in process and raw materials, the increase in these components was, in fact, partially offset by the decrease in finished products inventories. Without seasonal adjustment, inventories owned by durable goods manufacturers rose 0.4 per cent to $\$ 2,573.9$ million in April, while non-durable goods inventories owned recorded a decline of 0.3 per cent from March. The highest decreases of 1.9 to 3.4 per cent in inventories owned were reported by the paper and allied industries, the tobacco industries, the transportation equipment industries, and the clothing industries; the highest increases ranging from 1.8 to 2.5 per cent were shown by the non-metaliic mineral products industries, the machinery industries, and the petroleum and coal products industries.

In April, the ratio of the value of total inventories owned to the value of total shipments increased to 1.92 from 1.86 in March, although it was lower than the ratios of the first two months in 1965; the ratio of finished products inventories to shipments was 0.68 in April as compared with 0.66 in March.

## CONCEPTS

Shipments - (Tables 1 to 4) - represent an estimated projection, on monthly basis, af the latest available Census of Manufactures values.

New Orders - (Tables 2 and 3) - This series is designed to indicate the rate at which new business is being received. It is defined as all New Orders Received during the period, at estimated selling values. Thus it covers total new orders, net of cancellations, regardless of whether the orders will be filled from stock or as a result of activity during the same month (and, therefore, will also be reported as shipments in the month received) or whether they will be added to existing backlogs.

Unfilled Orders - (Tables 2 and 3) - are defined as orders on books at the end of the period stated. That is, they cover orders received but not yet shipped (or treated as a sale), irrespective of work done on them or of stocks from which they can be fllled.

Total Inventory Owned - (Tables 2 to 4) - represents the estimated book vslue of inventory owned by manufacturers in connection with the manufacturing operations of the establishment covered whether held at plant or elsewhere, at the end of the period stated. It is made up of: raw materials, goods in process, finished goods of own manufacture less the value of inventory held but not owned which cannot be assigned to specific components. Since the geries relates to manufacturing inventory only, value of goods purchased for re-sale is not included.

Inventory Held but Not Owned - (Tables 2 and 3) - represents, as far as possible, the portion of manufacturers' total inventory holdings which are no longer owned by the reporting manufacturers because of payments made on long-term contracts as work on these progresses. This item is applicable only to the relatively few industries where long-term contracts are comon although, because of the nature of the item, the value per industry is high.

Because of variations in accounting methods there are a few cases where it is not possible to obtain values for this type of inventory. The estimated value shown for this item mast therefore be considered to some extent incomplete.

Total Inventory Held - (Tables 2 and 3) - represents the estinated total value of manufacturers' inventory holdings in connection with manufacturing operations, regardless of ownership; it differs from inventory owned by the inclusion of inventories held under progress payments arrangements.

Inventory Components - (Tables 2 and 3) - Raw Materials, Goods in Process, and Finished products are reported and compiled as on the books of each manufacturet, 1 . e. there has been no attempt to define the components specifically for each industry.

The inventory components are always a breakdown of total inventory held, not of total inventory owned. In industies where these two items differ, due to the inclusion of inventory held but not owned (see above), it is not possible to obtain value of inventory owned by components since, where separate progress accounts are maintained, firms concerned can only state that, of total holdings, a certain amount is not longer owned by them. It is fairly obvious that the bulk of such payments apply to goods in process holdings but diue to time lags in shipments and to prepayments some of the total value of inventory held but not owned would be applicable to finished products or raw materials.

Any comparisons of shimments/inventory ratios should be made using total inventory owned, not total inventory held, since the latter includes values which have already been written off to sales. If shipments/inventory ratios are desired using inventory components, rather than total inventory, a reasonable approximation to total inventory owned by components would be obtained by assuming that all inventory held but not owned had been included with goods in process.

Groupings - The Standard Industrial Classification groupings of industries used in Tables 3 and 4 are defined according to the Standard Industrial Classification Manual. A list of the industries included In the Standard Industrial Classification grouns will be found on page 40 of the bulletin.

Monthly (or, in a Eew cases, quarterly) reports covering value of inventories and shipments are now submitted on a voluntary basis by 3,000 plants in 120 industries; in addition, 3,000 small plants in 100 of these industries report monthly shipments only. Of the first group, 1,025 plancs in 83 industries also report new and unfilled orders. Four industries are included in the total shipments estimates by using data available from other Bureau series, and two of these are also included in the total inventory estimates.

## FOOTNOTES TO TABLES
