ESTIMATED VALUES OF SHIPMENTS, INVENTORY OWNED AND UNFILLED ORDERS IN ALL MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES


Total value of shipments in Canadian manufacturing industries in February was up 2.3 per cent to a preliminary estimate of $\$ 2,806$ million from the revised estimate of $\$ 2,743$ million in January. New orders received in February totalled $\$ 2,836$ million, 1.3 per cent lower than the amount last month but larger than the February shipments; consequently, unfilled orders at the month's end were up by 0.9 per cent. Inventories owned at the end of February had also risen by 0.7 per cent from $\$ 5,796$ million to $\$ 5,838$ million. After adjusting for the seasonal pattern in February manufacturers' shipments, new orders and unfilled orders this month were all higher than in January by 1.5 per cent, 3.7 per cent and 0.9 per cent respectively, while inventories owned showed a slight drop of 0.2 per cent.

Shipments for the first two months of 1966 amounted to $\$ 5,549$ miliion, 13.5 per cent more than the value in the comparable period of 1965. The more than seasonal increase in shipments in February was shared equally by the durable and the non-durable goods industries. Relatively significant advances were shown in the clothing industries ( 24.3 per cent), the knitting mills ( 14.4 per cent), the furniture and fixtures industries ( 13.1 per cent) and the non-metallic mineral products industries (11.2 per cent).

February shipments in the tobacco industries showed a decline of 13.1 per cent from January which is in line with the pattern for February in the past two years. Moderate decreases in February shipments were recorded in the petroleum and coal products industries, the transportation equipment industries, the textile industries and the primary metal industries.

New orders for the durable goods industries in February dropped 2.9 per cent from the month before while the non-durable goods industries reported fractional increases. The small increase of the manufacturers' month-end backlog in February over January was attributable for the most part to the increase in the durable goods in= dustries.

Manufacturers' inventories held reached $\$ 6,108$ million at the end of February, 0.8 per cent higher than last month and 8.8 per cent more than the level in the corresponding month a year ago. The accumulation of manufacturers' inventories held in February was reflected only in goods in process and finished products; raw materials stocks were off slightly. Durable goods producers contributed the larger part of the increase in the February inventory level.

Comparatively substantial increases in inventories held in February were reported by the transportation equipment industries, 4.1 per cent, and the wood industries, 3.5 per cent. Foods and beverages industries reflected the usual inventory drop in February with a decline of 1.7 per cent. Nearly all major industry groups' inventories held at the end of February were higher than they were a year ago, except in the tobacco, leather and petroleum industry groups. Values of inventories held in the metal fabricating industries and the machinery industries were 17.1 per cent and 22.2 per cent respectively higher than they were in the same month a year ago.

The value of manufacturers' total inventories owned was 2.08 times the value of shipments in February compared with 2.11 last month and 2.15 in February 1965. The ratio of finished products inventory to shipments remained unchanged from January at 0.72 in February but is much lower than the ratio of 0.79 in February last year.

## CONCEPTS

Shipments - (Tables 1 to 4) = represent an estimated projection, on a monthly basis, of the latest avallable Census of Manufactures values.

New Orders - (Tables 2 and 3 ) - This series is designed to indicate the rate at which new business is being received. It is defined as all New Orders Received during the period, at estimated selling values. Thus it covers total new orders, net of cancellations, regardless of whether the orders will be filled from stock or as a result of activity durdng the same month (and, therefore, will also be reported as shipments in the month received) or whether they will be added to existing backlogs.

Unfilled Orders - (Tables 2 and 3) - are defined as orders on books at the end of the period stated. That is, they cover orders received but not yet shipped (or treated as a sale), Irrespective of work done on them or of stocks from which they can be filled.

Total Inventory Owned - (Tables 2 to 4) represents the estimated book value of inventory owned by manufacturers in connection with the manufacturing operations of the establishment covered whether held at plant or elsewhere, at the end of the period stated. It is made up of: raw materials, goods in process, Einished goods of own manufacture less the value of inventory held but not owned which cannot be assigned to specific components. Since the series relates to manufacturing inventory only, value of goods purchased for re-sale 18 not included.

Inventory Held but Not Owned (Tables 2 and 3) - represents, as far as possible, the portion of manufacturers total inventory holdings which are no longer owned by the reporting manufacturers because of payments made on long-term contracts as work on these progresses. This item is applicable only to rhe relacively few industries where long-term contracts are comon alchough, because of the nature of the item, the value per industry is high.

Because of variations in accounting methods there are a few cases where it is not possible to obtain values for this type of inventory. The estimated value shown for this item must therefore be considered to some extent incomplete.

Total Inventory Held - (Tables 2 and 3 ) - represents the estimated total value of manufacturers' inventory holdings in connection with manufacturing operations, regardless of ownership; it differs from inventory owned by the inclusion of inventories held under progress payments arrangements.

Inventory Components - (Tables 2 and 3) - Raw Materials, Goods in Process, and Finished Products are reported and compiled as on the books of each manufactures, i.e. there has been no attempt to define the components apecificaliy far each industry.

The inventory components are always a breakdown of total inventory held, not of total inventory owned. In industries where these two items differ, due to the inclusion of inventory held but not owned (see above), it is not possible to obtain Value of inventory owned by components since, where separate progress accounts are maintained, firms concerned can only state that, of total holdings, a certain amount is not longer owned by them. It is fairly obvious that the bulk of such payments apply to goods in process holdings but due to time lags in shlpments and to prepayments some of the total value of inventory held but not owned would be applicable to finished producta or raw materiala.

Any comparisons of shipments/inventory ratios should be made using total inventory owned, not total inventory held, since the latter includes values which have already been written off to sales. If shipments/inventory ratios are desired using inventory components, rather than total inventory, a reasonable approximation to total inventory owned by components would be obtained by aasuming that all inventory held but not owned had been included with gaods in process.

Groupings - The Standard Industrial Classification groupings of industries used in Tables 3 and 4 are defined according to the Standard Industrial Classification Manual. A list of the industries included in the Standard Industrisl Classification grouns will be found on page 40 of the bulletin.

Monthly (or, in few cases, quarterly) reports covering value of inventories and shipments are now submitted on a voluntary basis by 3,000 plants in 120 industries; in addition, 3,000 smali plants in 100 of these industries report monthly shipments only. Of the first group, 1,025 plants in 83 industries also report new and unfilled orders. Two industries are included in the total shipments estimates by using data available from ocher Bureau serles, and they are also included in the total inventory estimates.

TABLE 3. - (1) The value of Unfilled Orders and, therefore, of New Orders for industries in major groups - $1,2,6,8,9,10,17,18$ and 19 is small and sample coverage is mot adequate to provide separate estimates for them.
(2) The value of inventory held but not owned in this group is very small, and sample coverage is not adequate to provide separate data. Estimates for this type of inventory are included with Total Inventory Held; for all practical purposes this can be considered the equivalent of Inventory 0 wned.
