## ESTIMATED VALUES OF SHIPMENTS, INVENTORY OWNED AND UNFILLED ORDERS IN ALL MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES



Manufacturers' shipments, new orders and unfilled orders in March showed customary seasonal increases from February of 12.5 per cent, 13.3 per cent and 2.0 per cent respectively, but after adjustment for seasonal factors both shipments and new orders were 2.5 per cent lower than the previous month while unfilled orders were up by 1.1 per cent. Inventories owned by manufacturers at the end of March were higher by 0.6 per cent, or by 1.0 per cent seasonally adjusted, as compared with the level at the end of February.

The value of shipments in March was estimated at $\$ 3,166$ million, 8.0 per cent higher than that of March 1965. Total shipments for the first quarter of 1966 reached $\$ 8,723$ million, a rise of 11.5 per cent over the same period of last year. March shipments by durable goods producers were 14.8 per cent above the value in February, while non-durable goods manufacturers reported an increase of 10.3 per cent. All major industry groups indicated higher shipments in March, with relatively larger advances recorded in the tobacco industries ( 23.1 per cent) and the machinery industries ( 20.8 per cent). The electrical products industry group showed the smallest relative increase of shipments in the month, while the increase in shipments in the transportation equipment industry group, though substantial, was less than the increase from February to March 1965.

New orders received by the durable goods producers during March were 15.5 per cent higher than during February, and the increase in the level of manufacturers' unfllled orders at the end of March malnly resulted from the 2.4 per cent increase in unfilled orders in the durable goods industries.

At the estimate of $\$ 6,185$ million, manufacturers' inventories held at the end of March were 0.6 per cent above the level at the end of February and 9.3 per cent higher than at the end of March 1965. Most of the rise in March inventories after seasonal adjustment occurred in finished products. Inventories owned by durable goods manufacturers increased 0.4 per cent in March. Appreciable increases in inventories in the wood industries and in the electrical products industries were largely offset by a substantial drop in stocks owned by primary metal industries. Non-durable goods producers also reported higher stocks at the end of March; the $\$ 23.6$ million or 0.8 per cent build-up was accounted for chiefly by the tobacco industries.

Both the ratio of manufacturers' total inventories owned to shipments and the ratio of finished products inventory to shipments were at the usual seasonal low in March; they were estimated at 1.87 and 0.65 respectively compared with 2.09 and 0.72 in February.

## CONCEPTS

Shipments - (Tables 1 to 4) - represent an estimated projection, on a monthly basis, of the latest available Census of Manufactures values.

New 0rders - (Tables 2 and 3) - This series is designed to indicate the rate at which new business is being received, It is defined as all New Orders Received during the period, at estmated selling values. Thus it covers total new orders, net of cancellations, regardless of whether the orders will be filled Erom stock or as a result of activity during the same month (and, therefore, will also be reported as shipments in the month received) or whether they will be added to existing backlogs.

Unfilled Orders - (Tables 2 and 3) - are defined as orders on books at che end of the pertad stated. That is, they cover orders received but not yet shipped (or treated as a sale), irrespective of work done on them or of stocks from which they can be filled.

Total Inventory Owned - (Tables 2 to 4) - represents the estimated book value of inventory owned by manufacturers in connection with the manufacturing operations of the establishment covered whether held at plant or elsewhere, at the end of the period stated. It is made up of: raw materials, goods in process, finished goods of own manufacture less the value of inventory held but not owned which cannot be assigned to specific components. Since the series relates co manufacturing inventory only, value of goods purchased for re-sale is not included.

Inventory Held but Not Owned - (Tables 2 and 3) - represents, as far as possible, the portion of manufacturers' total inventory holdings which are no longer owned by the reporting manufacturers because of payments made on long-term contracts as work on these progresses. This item is applicable only to the relatively few industries where long-term contracts are conmon although, because of the nature of the item, the value per industry is high.

Because of variations in accounting methods there are few cases where it is not possible to obtain values for this type of inventory. The estimated value shown for this item must therefare be considered to some extent incomplete.

Total Inventory Held - (Tables 2 and 3) - representg the estimated total value of manufacturers' inventory holdings in connection with manufacturing operations, regardless of ownership; it differs from inventory owned by the inclusion of inventories held under progress payments arrangements.

Inventory Components - (Tables 2 and 3) - Raw Materials, Goods in Process, and Finished Products are reported and complled as on the books of each manufacturer, i.e. there has been no atcempt to define the components specifically for each industry.

The inventary components are always a breakdown of total inventory held, not of total inventory owned. In industries where these two items differ, due co che inclusion of inventory held but not owned (see above), it is not possible to obtain value of inventory owned by components since, where separate progress accounts are madntained, firms concerned can only state that, of cotal holdings, a certain amount is not longer owned by them. It is fairly obvious that the bulk of such payments apply to goods in process holdings but due to time lags in shipments and to prepayments some of the total value of inventory held but not owned would be applicable to finished products or raw materials.

Any comparisons of shipments/inventory ratios should be made using total inventory owned, not total inventory held, since the latter includes values which have already been written off to sales. If shipments/inventary ratios are desired using inventory components, rather than total inventory, a reasonable approximation to total inventory owned by components would be obtained by assuming that all inventory held but not owned had been included with goods in process.

Groupings - The Standard Industrial Classification groupings of industries used in Tables 3 and 4 are defined according to the Standard Industrial Classification Manual. A list of the industries inciuded in the Standard Industrial Classification grouns will be found on page 40 of the bulletin.

Monthly (or, in a few cases, quarterly) reports covering value of inventories and shipments are now submitted on s voluntary basis by 3,000 plants in 120 industries; in addition, 3,000 small plants in 100 of these industries report monthly shipments only. Of the first group, 1,025 plants in 83 industries also report new and unfllled orders. Two industifes are included in the total shipments estimates by using dsta available from other Bureau series, and they are also fncluded in the total inventory estimates.

TABLE 3. - (1) The value of Unfilled Orders and, therefore, of New Orders for industries in major groups - $1,2,6,8,9,10,17,18$ and 19 is small and sample coverage is not adequate to provide separate estimates for them.
(2) The value of inventory held but not owned in this group is very small, and sample coverage is not adequate to provide separate data. Estimates for this type of inventory are included with Total Inventory Held; for all practical purposes this can be considered the equivalent of Inventory Owned.
