Preliminary estimates of April shipments and new orders in the manufacturing industries dropped 7.1 per cent and 8.8 per cent respectively from the revised estimates for March. The backlog of unfilled orders at the end of April increased less than 1 per cent from the end-of-March level while manufacturers' inventories at the end of April indicated very little change. After adjustment for seasonal variation, manufacturers' shipments and new orders in April again were lower than March by 1.8 and 2.2 per cent; unfilled orders and inventories owned at the end of April, however, were up by 1.3 per cent and 0.2 per cent respectively.

Manufacturers' April shipments valued at the preliminary estimate of $\$ 3,012$ million, brought the total shipments in the January-April period to $\$ 11,813$ million, 11.1 per cent higher than in the corresponding period in the previous year with shipments of $\$ 10,629$ million. Shipments of durable goods producers were down 8.0 per cent in April while non-durable goods producers also reported a decline of 6.3 per cent from March.

All major industry groups reported lower shipments in April as compared with March with the exception of the electrical products industries and the chemical and chemical products industries in both of which shipments were 0.8 per cent above the values in March. Relatively significant decreases were recorded in the tobacco industries of 24.5 per cent, and in both the knitting mills and the clothing industries of 20.9 per cent. At the preliminary estimate of $\$ 378$ million, the transportation equipment industries reported the largest absolute decline in shipments from March, and at this level were only 1.8 per cent above the value in April, 1965. April shipments in the electrical products industries did not show the usual decline from the March level but remained at about the same level as last month, and were 22.0 per cent higher than April 1965.

New orders received by durable goods manufacturers during April were down 11.0 per cent to $\$ 1,494$ million from $\$ 1,679$ million in March, but were still above the value of shipments for the month. Unfilled orders in the durable goods manufacturing industries at the end of April rose from $\$ 2,879$ miliion in March to $\$ 2,913$ million which was 15.6 per cent higher than the April level a year earlier.

The small increase in the seasonally adjusted estimate of inventories held at the end of April was attributable to the increase in raw materials; a slight increase in the finished products inventory was offset by a small decrease in the goods in process inventory. Inventories owned by the non-durable goods producers at the end of April dropped slightly to below the level in March, while the durable goods manufacturers' end-of-April inventories owned showed a fractional increase. Inventories owned in the tobacco industries which reported the largest relative decrease of inventory were off by 2.9 per cent from the record high reached in March. Comparatively large increases were shown in the rubber industries and the miscellaneous industries. Compared with the comparable levels in the previous year, inventories owned by the transportation equipment industries and the machinery industries at the end of April remained at the highest among the major industry groups.

In April, the value of manufacturers' inventories owned was 1.97 times the value of shipments, compared with 1.83 in March. The ratio of finished products inventory to shipments in the manufacturing industries was 0.69 , higher than the ratio of $0.64 \mathrm{in} \mathrm{March}$.

## CONCEPTS

Shipments - (Tables 1 to 4) - represent an estimated profection, on monthly basis, of the latest available Census of Manufactures values

New Orders - (Tables 2 and 3) - This series is designed to indicate the race at which new business is being received. It is defined as all New Orders Recefved during the period, at estimated selling values. Thus it covers total new arders, net of cancellations, regardless of whekher the orders will be filled Erom stock or as a result of activity during the same month (and, therefore, will also be reported as shipments in the month received) or whether they will be added to existing backlogs.

Unfilied Orders - (Tables 2 and 3) - are defined as orders on books at the end of the period stated. That is, they cover orders recefved but not yet shipped (or created as a sale), irrespective of work done on them or of stocks from which they can be filled.

Total Inventory owned - (Tables 2 to 4) - represents the estimated book value of inventory owned by manufscturers in connection with the manufacturing operations of the establishment covered whether held at plant or elsewhere, at the end of the period stated. It is made up of: raw materials, goods in process, finished goods of own manufacture less the value of inventory held but not owned which cannot be assigned ta specific components. Since the series relates to manufacturing inventary only, value of goods purchased for re-sale is not included.

Inventory Held but Not Owned - (Tables 2 and 3) - represents, as far as possible, the portion of manufacturers' total inventory holdings which are no longer owned by the reporting manufacturers because of payments made on long-term contracts as work on these progresses. This item is applicable only to the relatively few industries where long-term contracts are common although, because of the nature of the item, the value per industry is high.

Because of variations in accounting methods there are a few cases where it is not possible to obtain values for this type of inventory. The estimated value shown for this item must therefore be considered to scme extent incomplete.

Total Inventory Held - (Tables 2 and 3) - represents the estimated total value of manufacturers inventory holdings in connection with manufacturing operations, regardless of ownership; it differs from inventory owned by the inclusion of inventories held under progress payments arrangements.

Inventory Components - (Tables 2 and 3) - Raw Materials, Goods in Process, and Finished Products are reported and compiled as on che books of each manufacturer, i.e. there has been no attempt to define the componenta specifically for each industry.

The inventory components are always a breakdown of cotal inventory held, not of cotal inventory owned. In industries where these two 1 tems differ, due to the inclusion of inventory held but not owned (see above), it is not possible to obtain value of inventory owned by components since, where separate progress accounts are maintained, firms concerned can only atate that, of total holdings, a certain amount is not longet owned by them. It is fairly obvious that the bulk of such payments apply to goods in process holdings but due co time lags in shipments and to prepayments some of the total value of tnventory held but not owned would be fpplicable to finished products or raw materials.

Any comparisons of shipments/inventory ratios should be made using cotal inventory owned, not total inventory held, since the latter includes values which have already been written off to sales. If shipments/inventory ratios are desired using inventory components, rather than total inventory, a reasonable approximation to total inventory owned by componentis would be obtained by assuming that all inventory held but not owned had been included ulth goods in process.

Groupings - The Standari Industrial Classification groupings of industries used in Tables 3 and 4 are defined according to the Standard Industrial Classlfication Manual. A list of the industries included in che Standard Industrial Ciassification groups will be found on page 40 of the bulletin.

## SOURCES

Monthiy (or, in a few cases, quarterly) reports covering value of inventories and shipments are now subnitted on a voluntary basis by 3,000 plants in 120 industries; in addition, 3,000 small plants in 100 of these industries report monthly shipments only. Of the Eirst group, 1,025 plants in 83 industries also report new and unfilled orders. Two industries are included in the cotal shipments estimates by using data available from other Burean serlea, and chey are also included in the total inventory estimates.

(2) The value of inventory held but not owned in this group is very small, and sample coverage is not adequate to provide separate data. Estimates for this type of inventory are included with Total Inventory Held; for all practical purposes this can be considered the equivalent of Inventory Owned.
