## TREND SUMMARY

The value of manufacturers' shipments in October at $\$ 3,268$ miliion was slightly Migher than the estimate of $\$ 3,259$ million for September, while new orders received during October increased substantially from $\$ 3,150 \mathrm{million}$ to $\$ 3,287$ million. However, after allowances were made for trading-day and seasonal influences, October shipments dropped 3.0 per cent after rising steadily during the preceding four months; the value of new orders seasonally adjusted was also down slightly by 0.1 per cent. The backlog of unfilled orders at the end of October rose 0.5 per cent to $\$ 3,737$ million from the end of September, and also rose 1.3 per cent to $\$ 3,808$ million after seasonal adjustment. Total manufacturing inventory holdings reached $\$ 7,131$ million at the end of October, marginally up from $\$ 7,125$ million of the previous month. Seasonally adjusted total inventory holdings were 0.1 per cent down; an increase in raw materials was slightly more than offset by decreases in goods in process and finished products.

At the cumulative estimate of $\$ 31,006$ milion, manufacturing shipments from January to October remained at 2.2 per cent higher than in the same period of last year. The cumulative shipments for both durable and non-durable manufacturing groups in the first ten months showed 0.9 per cent and 3.2 per cent respectively above the corresponding estimates of last year. The small increase in October shipments, before adjustment for trading-day and seasonal factors, was rather evenly reflected in durable and non-durable goods categories.

In October, relatively more significant increases in shipments were reported In the rubber industries ( 5.9 per cent) and the petroleum and coal products industries ( 6.3 per cent). In terms of contribution, other marked gains were also recorded in the transportation equipment ( 3.6 per cent) and the primary metal ( 4.8 per cent) industries. These rises in October were, to a great extent, offset by decreases in many other industry groups, especially in the electrical products ( -6.2 per cent) and the clothing ( -9.7 per cent) industries.

New orders received by durable goods manufacturers in October rose 9.3 per cent to $\$ 1,481$ milion from $\$ 1,355$ million in the previous month, and 4.7 per cent from $\$ 1,415$ million in October 1966. Unfilled orders of durable goods in October edged up 0.7 per cent from September. The most substantial actual value increases in new orders and unfilled orders for the month occurred in the shipbuilding and the railroad roliing stock industries within the transportation equipment group of industries.

Manufacturers' owned inventories in October were fractionally higher than those of the previous month, but fell 0.3 per cent after seasonal adjustment. Owned stocks of durable goods were down 0.5 per cent in October with decreases occurring mainly in finished products and raw materials. Non-durable goods industries on the other hand, reported a small rise of 0.6 per cent in owned stocks with the largest increase in raw materials.

Based on the preliminary estimate, without seasonal adjustment, fourteen major industry groups recorded decreases in owned inventories in October with relatively more noticeable drops showing in the tobacco ( -4.2 per cent) and the leather ( -3.3 per cent) industries. These decreases, however, were slightly over balanced by the substantial increases in the foods and beverages ( 2.3 per cent), the paper and allied romites ( 4.1 per cent) and the primary metal ( 2.2 per cent) industry groups.

The ratio of manufacturers' owned inventories to shipments in October stayed at 2.06 as in the previous month, while that of finished products to shipments clropped slightly from 0.76 to 0.75 . Based on seasonally adjusted data, these ratios for October were up to 2.17 and 0.80 from 2.11 and 0.78 respectively in September.

 monthly shipments and inventories and unfilled orders on the books at the end of the month estimated on the basis of the latest census of manufactures by monthly returns from representative establishments in each industry. The December 1966 bulletin is the first issue in which the census base of 1964 is used. Values for 1962,1963 and 1964 are derived directly from each annual census; values for 1965 and 1966 are projected from the 1964 census. The aggregate monthly shipments for each year which is based directly on a census should equal published census values. The year end inventory values published here are for December and thus will differ from the year end census values to the extent which establishments have reported to the census on a fiscal year ending at a date other than December 31. Unfilled orders on books are published for industries where orders are part of the accounting record.

The monthly survey covers approximately 6,500 establishments. The survey accepts combinations of establishments within companies on a monthly basis to accommodate monthly accounting records and also accepts estimetes of inventories and orders values if actual records are not avallable. Many establishments in several industries take inventory only ammally and keep no record of orders as orders. The number of firms reporting actual inventory values is approximately two-thirds of the total reporting shipments; approximately one third report unfilled orders.

The monthly sample of establishments in the survey is revised annually in accordance with the census base and the list is kept constant between revisions. The identity of an establishment is also retained between revisions. This is done because, simply stated, the estimates are calculated by multiplying the sum of monthly reported values for each industry in each province by the ratio of the establishments in the sample to the census total for the same unit. Separate ratios are calculated for shipments, inventories and unfilled orders. If a report is not received in time for the monthly compllation an estimated value is written in. Since each month is published first as a preliminary value monthly returns are accepted up to the time the machine compllation is begun and late returns for the month will be used one month later in the revised estimate. Returns recefvai aftur bogiming the compilation for the next month (i.e. January returns received aftet sis iaccuavy compilathon ia begun) are not used in the estimates until the following annual revision.

Thus changes in the monthly series will arise from changes in the idetity of antublissinents between censuses, and from the substitution of reported for estimated values.

The inventory values published are shown both for total inventory owned and total inventory held by an establishment. The difference between these values is the amount of inventory financed by progress payments as the work proceeds on goods being produced. Since some goods manufactured are held as in-progress inventory for a considerable time the book value of manufacturers' inventory may build up and, to the extent that this has been covered by the payment received, is higher than the manufecturers' investment in inventory. Both the amount of the manufacturers' investment in inventories and the amount of inventory held by manufacturers is of economic interest. It is also interesting to distinguish between inventory held by the degree of fabrication which has taken place. Consequently firms are asked to report their stocks by level of fabrication: raw materials and components; work in progress and finished products.

Unfilled orders cover orders recelved but not yet shipped, or treated as a sale, frrespective of work done on them or stocks from which they can be filled. Establishments in many industries do not msintain order books but $f 111$ orders as they are received from stocks. Most establishments which do maintain order books strike a value of unfilled orders on their books at the end of each accounting period. New orders received, although an estimate of considerable interest to economists as an indication of the rate at which new business is being received, is not often available from accounting records. Consequently the estimate for new orders pubilshed here is derived by industry, by province from the relationship between unfilled orders and shipments.

The definitions, classifications and groupings are taken from the census of manufactures.
