## MONTHLY REPORT

## PRODUCTION OF IRON AND STEEL IN CANADA

## JUNE, 1939

PIG IRON - Production of pig iron in Canada during June amounted to 52,805 long tons, or 8.5 per cent less than in the previous month and 18 per cent less than in June of last year. Output in the current month included 50,178 tons of basic, 399 tons of foundry, and 2,228 tons of malleable iron.

Furnace charges for the month consisted of 90,744 long tons of imported iron ore, 27,125 short tons of limestone, and 55,795 short tons of coke.

The cumulative production of pig iron for the year to date was 296,521 tons which was 26 per cent below the corresponding total for last year.

FERRO-ALLOYS - Output of ferro-alloys during June totalled 10,015 tons as against 4,925 tons in May. The total for the six months of 1939 was 30,904 tons compared with 33,159 tons for the first half of 1938.

STEEL INGOTS AND CASTINGS - The June production of steel ingots and direct steel castings was 107,902 tons, or 11 per cent less than the tonnage made during the previous month. The output of ingots dropped to 103,953 tons from 116,983 tons in May and the production of steel castings declined to 3,949 tons from 4,430 tons.

For the first six months of this year the output of ingots and castings totalled 580,141 tons or 13.5 per cent less than during the corresponding period of last year.

PRICES - Except for advances of 50 cents per ton in quotations for charging box size scrap steel and turnings and borings, prices of iron and steel products were generally unchanged in June. The Bureau's index number of wholesale prices of Iron and Its Products on the base 1926 = 100 rose from 97.3 in May to 97.4 in the following month, largely reflecting the higher prices already noted for scrap steel. Pig iron prices were unchanged from those of the previous month, No. 1 foundry, f.o.b. plant, being quoted at \$20.00 per gross ton.
