IRON CASTINGS AND CAST IRON PIPES AND FITTINGS

April - 1953

Total tonnage of iron castings of all kinds made during April amounted to 74,100 tons, of which 51,300 tons were shipped and about 22,800 tons used in the producing plants.

Pig iron used by iron foundries during the month amounted to 30,200 tons, while consumption of scrap iron and steel totalled 53,100 tons in the same period.
