

Total tonnage of iron castings of all kinds made during October amounted to 61,000 tons, while shipments totalled 46,900 tons.

Pig iron used by iron foundries during the month amounted to 22,400 tons, while consumption of scrap iron and steel totalled 53,000 tons in the same period.
