Total tonnage of iron castings of all kinds made during October amounted to 86,655 tons, while shipments totalled 63,083 tons.

Pig iron used by iron foundries during the month amounted to 28,400 tons, while consumption of scrap iron and steel totalled 70,900 tons in the same period.
