Memorandum

IRON CASTINGS AND CAST IRON PIPES AND FITTINGS (Including steel pipe, tubing and fittings)

Total tonnage of iron castings of all kinds made during December amounted to 71,981 tons, while shipments totalled 47,422 tons.

Pig iron used by iron foundries during the month amounted to 26,700 tons, while consumption of scrap iron and steel totalled 55,200 tons in the same period.
