This report is the first of a new series covering monthly production and factory sales of stoves and warm air furnaces.

Producers' sales of stoves in Canada were valued at \$2,942,433 in January, 1950. Blectric ranges alone totalled 8,699 units worth \$1,299,502.

Producers' sales of warm air furnaces in January amounted to 3,970 units valued at \$492,998.
