STOVES AND FURNACES

DECEMBER - 1950

Producers' sales of stoves and furnaces in Canada were valued at \$5,215,310 in December, 1950. Electric ranges alone totalled 13,399 units worth \$2,316,379.

Producers' sales of warm air furnaces in December amounted to 7,277 units valued at \$1,129,628.
