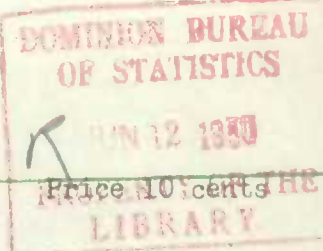

STOVES AND FURNACESAPRIL, 1950

Producers' sales of stoves and furnaces in Canada were valued at \$3,460,064 in April, 1950. Electric ranges alone totalled 11,843 units worth \$1,718,129.

Producers' sales of warm air furnaces in April amounted to 3,674 units valued at \$326,312.
