

## STEEL WIRE AND SPECIFIED WIRE PRODUCTS

Shipments of steel wire by Canadian producers amounted to 13,207 tons in November, 1955, compared with 9,363 tons in the corresponding month of 1954. This month's total included 9,674 tons of plain wire, 3,149 tons of galvanized wire, 162 tons of other coated wire, 162 tons of barbed wire and 60 tons of cold rolled flat wire.

Producers' shipments of wire fencing in the current month were higher than in November of last year, the amounts being 791 tons and 606 tons, respectively, and the shipments of steel wire nails were up to 8,944 tons from 5,035 tons in November, 1954.
