STIFL WIRE AND SPECIFIED WIRE PRODUCTS

Shipments of steel wire by Canadian producers amounted to 13,028 tons in May, 1955, compared with 9,556 tons in the corresponding month of 1954. This month's total included 8,367 tons of plain wire, 3,270 tons of galvanized wire, 171 tons of other coated wire, 1,161 tons of barbed wire and 59 tons of cold rolled flat wire.

Producers' shipments of wire fencing in the current month were higher than in May of last year, the amounts being 2,872 tons and 2,754 tons respectively, and the shipments of steel wire nails were up to 8,204 tons from 7,037 tons in May, 1954.
