STEEL WIRE AND SPECIFIED WIRE PRODUCTS

Shipments of steel wire by Canadian producers amounted to 13,684 tons in June, 1955, compared with 10,352 tons in the corresponding month of 1954. This month's total included 9,028 tons of plain wire, 3,237 tons of galvanized wire, 166 tons of other coated wire, 1,171 tons of barbed wire and 82 tons of cold rolled flat wire.

Producers' shipments of wire fencing in the current month were higher than in June of last year, the amounts being 2,421 tons and 2,335 tons respectively, and the shipments of steel wire nails were up to 9,795 tons from 7,512 tons in June, 1954.
