STREL WIRE AND SPECIFIED WIRE PRODUCTS

Shipments of steel wire by Canadian producers amounted to 9,734 tons in August, 1955, compared with 8,779 tons in the corresponding month of 1954. This month's total included 6,720 tons of plain wire, 2,421 tons of galvanized wire, 105 tons of other coated wire, 435 tons of barbed wire and 53 tons of cold rolled flat wire.

Producers' shipments of wire fencing in the current month were higher than in August of last year, the amounts being 1,347 tons and 895 tons, respectively, and the shipments of steel wire nails were up to 8,412 tons from 6,996 tons in August, 1954.
