SEPTEMBER - 1949

Shipments of steel wire by Canadian producers amounted to 9,223 tons in September, 1949, compared with 9,043 tons in the corresponding month of 1948. This month's total included 5,677 tons of plain wire, 2,228 tons of galvanized wire, 147 tons of other coated wire, 1,029 tons of barbed wire and 142 tons of cold rolled flat wire.

Producers' shipments of wire fencing in the current month were lower than in September of last year, the amounts being 1,063 tons and 1,386 tons respectively, and the shipments of steel wire nails were down to 7,963 tons from 8,058 tons in September, 1948.


