STEEL VIRE AND SPECIFIED WIRE PRODUCTS

## OCTOBER - 1950


Shipments of steel wire by Canadian producers amounted to 10,487 tons in October, 1950 compared with 8,043 tons in the corresponding month of 1949. This month's total included 6,773 tons of plain wire, 2,835 tons of galvanized wire, 168 tons of other coated wire, 550 tons of barbed wire and 161 tons of cold rolled flat wire.

Producers' shipments of wire fencing in the current month were higher than in October of last year, the amounts being 1,081 tons and 679 tons respectively and the shipments of steel wire nails were down to 7,856 tons from 8,242 tons in October, 1949.


