

TEEL WIRE AND SPECIFIED WIRE PRODUCTS

MARCH - 1950

Shipments of steel wire by Canadian producers amounted to 11,206 tons in March, 1950 compared with 10,629 tons in the corresponding month of 1949. This month's total included 6,810 tons of plain wire, 2,547 tons of galvanized wire, 145 tons of other coated wire, 1,517 tons of barbed wire and 187 tons of cold rolled flat wire.

Producers' shipments of wire fencing in the current month were lower than in March of last year, the amounts being 2,525 tons and 3,296 tons respectively, and the shipments of steel wire nails were up to 8,058 tons from 7,663 tons in March, 1949.




