STEEL WIRE AND SPECIFIED VIRE PRODUCTS

JUNE - 1950

Shipments of steel wire by Canadian producers amounted to 10,536 tons in June, 1950 compared with 9,642 tons in the corresponding month of 1949. This month's total included 6,138 tons of plain wire, 2,845 tons of galvanized wire, 183 tons of other coated wire, 1,183 tons of barbed wire and 187 tons of cold rolled flat wire.

Producers' shipments of wire fencing in the current month were higher than in June of last year, the amounts being 2,569 tons and 2,562 tons respectively and the shipments of steel wire nails were down to 7,389 tons from 9,156 tons in June, 1949.


