# JANUARY - 1951

Shipments of steel wire by Canadian producers amounted to 10,777 tons in January, 1951 compared with 9,601 tons in the corresponding month of 1950. This month's total included 7,042 tons of plain wire, 2,413 tons of galvanized wire, 154 tons of other coated wire, 965 tons of barbed wire and 203 tons of cold rolled flat wire.

Producers' shipments of wire fencing in the current month were higher than in January of last year, the amounts being 2,306 tons and 2,124 tons respectively and the shipments of steel wire nails were up to 7,511 tons from 6,399 tons in January, 1950.


