

STEEL WIRE AND SPECIFIED WIRE PRODUCTS

DECEMBER - 1951

Shipments of steel wire by Canadian producers amounted to 8,902 tons in December, 1951, compared with 10,055 tons in the corresponding month of 1950. This month's total included 5,894 tons of plain wire, 2,236 tons of galvanized wire, 152 tons of other coated wire, 509 tons of barbed wire and 111 tons of cold rolled flat wire.

Producers' shipments of wire fencing in the current month were higher than in December of last year, the amounts being 582 tons and 512 tons respectively, and the shipments of steel wire nails were down to 6,303 tons from 6,596 tons in December, 1950.
