STEEL WIRE AND SPECIFIED WIRE PRODUCTS

FEBRUARY - 1951

Shipments of steel wire by Canadian producers amounted to 9,707 tons in February, 1951 compared with 8,892 tons in the corresponding month of 1950. This month's total included 6,287 tons of plain wire, 2,001 tons of galvanized wire, 152 tons of other coated wire, 1,188 tons of barbed wire and 79 tons of cold rolled flat wire.

Producers' shipments of wire fencing in the current month were higher than in February of last year, the amounts being 2,300 tons and 1,764 tons respectively and the shipments of steel wire nails were up to 6,878 tons from 5,791 tons in February, 1950.


