STEEL WIRE AND SPECIFIED WIRE PRODUCTS

JULY - 1951

Shipments of steel wire by Canadian producers amounted to 9,653 tons in July, 1951 compared with 8,605 tons in the corresponding month of 1950. This month's total included 6,342 tons of plain wire, 2,331 tons of galvanized wire, 172 tons of other coated wire, 666 tons of barbed wire and 142 tons of cold rolled flat wire.

Producers shipments of wire fencing in the current month were lower than in July of last year, the amounts being 1,776 tons and 1,835 tons respectively and the shipments of steel wire nails were down to 6,903 tons from 7,101 tons in July, 1950.
