FEBRUARY - 1952

Shipments of steel wire by Canadian producers amounted to 9,658 tons in February, 1952 compared with 9,707 tons in the corresponding month of 1951. This month's total included 5,958 tons of plain wire, 2,555 tons of galvanized wire, 189 tons of other coated wire, 824 tons of barbed wire and 132 tons of cold rolled flat wire.

Producers' shipments of wire fencing in the current month were higher than in February of last year, the amounts being 2,381 tons and 2,300 tons respectively and the shipments of steel wire nails were up to 7,282 tons from 6,828 tons in February, 1951.
