STEEL WIRE AND SPECIFIED WIRE PRODUCTS

APRIL - 1952

Shipments of steel wire by Canadian producers amounted to 11,539 tons in April, 1952 compared with 11,166 tons in the corresponding month of 1951. This month's total included 7,131 tons of plain wire, 2,882 tons of galvanized wire, 184 tons of other coated wire, 1,226 tons of barbed wire and 116 tons of cold rolled flat wire.

Producers' shipments of wire fencing in the current month were lower than in April of last year, the amounts being 2,468 tons and 2,633 tons respectively and the shipments of steel wire nails were up to 7,465 tons from 6,921 tons in April, 1951.
