STEEL WIRE AND SPECIFIED WIRE PRODUCTS

August - 1953

Shipments of steel wire by Canadian producers amounted to 7,435 tons in August, 1953, compared with 7,523 tons in the corresponding month of 1952. This month's total included 5,212 tons of plain wire, 1,567 tons of galvanized wire, 115 tons of other coated wire, 451 tons of barbed wire and 90 tons of cold rolled flat wire.

Producers' shipments of wire fencing in the current month were higher than in August of last year, the amounts being 804 tons and 751 tons respectively, and the shipments of steel wire nails were up to 5,959 tons from 5,182 tons in August of 1952.
