STEEL WIRE AND SPECIFIED WIRE PRODUCTS

Shipments of steel wire by Canadian producers amounted to 9,363 tons in November, 1954, compared with 9,665 tons in the corresponding month of 1953. This month's total included 6,711 tons of plain wire, 2,347 tons of galvanized wire, 113 tons of other coated wire, 75 tons of barbed wire and 117 tons of cold rolled flat wire.

Producers' shipments of wire fencing in the current month were lower than in November of last year, the amounts being 606 tons and 932 tons respectively, and the shipments of steel wire nails were down to 5,035 tons from 5,923 tons in November, 1953.
